VIVACIOUSLY CELEBRATED IN A SOCIAL WAY.

LAHAINA, January 7.—Captain and Mrs. Aldhorn gave a delightful dancing party Saturday evening last to celebrate the end of the old and the beginning of the new year. PAIA, January 7.—The two most notable New Year's events in central Maui were dances given by Mr. and Mrs. H. A. Baldwin, at their Hanakapoko residence, and by W. J. Lowrie, in the Spreckelsville hall.

The dance at Hanakapoko was one of the most enjoyable social events given during the year, the spacious rooms, the polished floor and the most excellent music, rendering dancing irresistible. The rooms were tastefully decorated with flowers and greens, the broad staircase, with its grill work intertwined with ivy, and set with palms and portul plants, deserving special mention. The music was by the Wahee Quintette club, and their singing between dances was a feature of the evening.

Dancing was kept up until midnight, when an anvil was fired off, and the company present gave three cheers for the new year, three for the past one, and wished each other a Happy New Year. Refreshments were served during the evening.

The Spreckelsville dance was also a thoroughly enjoyable affair. The hall as usual was decorated with greens and plants, and presented a most inviting appearance. Good music was furnished by a native stringed orchestra and a very large company was present. Dancing under the direction of M. J. McLane was continued until midnight, with an intermission at 11:30 for supper. A fine supper of salads, sandwiches, coffee, etc., was served in the supper room adjoining the hall, and when 12 o'clock came all present were dancing the old year out in most approved style.
