ANOTHER TRANSPORT.
SAN FRANCISCO, July 11. - The Canadian Pacific liner Tartar, lately chartered by the government to carry troops to Manila, arrived from the north yesterday and was docked at the government wharf at the foot of Fishon street. She will be prepared with all expedition for her new service. The Tartar is one of the finest steamers on the Pacific. She arrived from Southampton almost new a little more than a year ago. Her gross tonnage is 4425, length 375 feet, beam 47 feet and depth 33.3 feet. She is fitted with triple expansion engines and lighted throughout with electricity. She has a large promenade deck, which is closed in with awning. The social hall and first and second saloons are splendidly and luxuriously furnished. The woodwork is of polished oak. The Tartar's life boats are numerous enough to form a small flotilla. Captain E. R. Hutchins, U. S. A. will serve as quartermaster and commissary on the Tartar.

MORE TRANSPORTS.
SAN FRANCISCO, July 12. - The transport Conemaugh, loaded with cavalry horses, sailed for Manila yesterday afternoon. Three of the horses had sickened during their short confinement and were brought ashore, together with one that had escaped in the night from its stall and scalped itself against a sharp iron projection from the deck overhead. The City of Para took on her supply of fresh meat and ice yesterday. She will sail tomorrow with cavalry and a part of the Twenty-fourth infantry. General Schwan, who is to be General Otis' chief of staff, sails upon her. Orders were issued yesterday to Colonel W. H. Bisbee, Thirtieth infantry; Colonel G. S. Parker, Eighteenth infantry, and Captain D. J. Carr of the Signal Corps to proceed to Manila on the City of Para.

The Tartar is to sail on July 22. She will carry about 1100 men of the Nineteenth infantry, now at Camp Meade, Pennsylvania. General Joseph Wheeler will be in command of her.
