Reports of the Various Collectors of Customs.

The Collector of Customs has received the reports of the collectors at other island ports showing the exports for the month of August. They are as follows:

Kahului—6,455,968 pounds sugar, \$254,326.23; 68 hides, \$136; 8 logs koa lumber, \$230.
Hilo—9,759,689 pounds sugar, \$385,957.33; 825 pounds tallow, \$27.50; sundries, \$463.10.
Mahukona and Honolulu—900,093 pounds sugar, \$35,594.40.

Melodrama of the Mines at the Opera House.


