AUTOMOBILE ABOUT TOWN

OBJECT OF MUCH ATTENTION TODAY.

Various People Take It Out for a Spin and are Delighted With the Novelty. More are Coming.

Baldwin's automobile has been the object of much attention about the streets today. It has been flying in and out almost all the while. This morning Theo. Hoffman, manager of the Hawaiian Electric Company, had it out for a spin. He took with him different friends.

This automobile is not large nor excessively heavy. The body is the exact size of an ordinary top buggy. The seat is made for two, but seems rather narrow for some of Honolulu's heavy weights. Having a top it is just as serviceable as a buggy in rainy weather.

The mechanism, as is well known, is simple and can be manipulated by anyone. Any speed desired can be attained, up to that of an electric car. The vehicle carries bicycle tires and its transit is noiseless. A bell warns pedestrians of its approach at street corners. It can be stopped quicker than a horse and started as easily as an electric car.

There has been little trouble with it about town. Very few horses have attempted thus far to step on it. This morning a Chinese stevedore named away from the mysterious roadster, probably the first time he had taken so much exercise in 27 years, but did no damage. Other horses eyed the intruder suspiciously, but seemed to size it up as one of the accidents of this "transition" period in Hawaii's political history.

Numerous people have had rides in the vehicle. Among them have been E. D. Tenney, J. B. Castle and E. R. Folsom. They all express themselves as much pleased with the novelty. Several automobiles are now being constructed for Honolulu, and in a few weeks they will be as common here as vegetable wagons.
