MEMORANDA.  
A large four-masted schooner has just been launched from Hall Brothers' shipyard at Port Blakely. The vessel was built for Captain J. H. Bennett, Captain Goddard, Captain Humphrey, Captain Jensen and others of that port, to engage in the Hawaiian trade. She has already begun to load lumber at the Sound for Hilo. It is estimated that she will reach the island in time to get a return cargo of sugar. The new vessel has been christened the Lottie Bennett.

The lateness of the China yesterday was due to care in the using of coal. Owing to the shortage of coal at this port enough was taken at San Francisco to last her to the end of her journey and slow time was made rather than use more than was necessary between San Francisco and here.

News was received by the China of the death of Capt. Frederick A. Gardner, who was for many years in command of the Occidental and Oriental S. S. Doric. He died on the 7th of this month, at his home in Berkeley, at the age of 75 years.

The Russian steamer Dolney Vastok, which left here a short time ago to take a charter as a transport, arrived in San Francisco on the 5th, in distress, her machinery breaking down just outside the harbor. Her lateness will probably cost her the charter.

The schooner Aloha arrived this morning in command of Captain T. Fry, who has been her first mate for many years. Captain Dabel, her former master, has gone East to take charge of another vessel.


