The Captain reports a very rough trip. During one afternoon and evening the vessel lay to, while oil was spread on the waters to keep down the waves.

The British bark County of Merioneth, which arrived yesterday from Liverpool, was 162 days out, being becalmed off the Horn for several weeks.
