## COMING MOTOR VEHICLES

REPORT ON THE RECENT BERLIN EXHIBITION.

Consul-General Mason Says Not a Single American or British Manufacturer Represented in His Own Name.

An International exposition of motor vehicles has just been held in Berlin. It was opened in the presence of the Emperor and many other distinguished personages. United States Consul-General Frank H. Mason at Berlin, has made a comprehensive report of it to the State Department which has been published in the consular reports, copiously illustrated.

Among other things he says: "The exhibition proper has been made by one hundred and twenty firms and companies, of whom eighty-one are German, four Belgian, twelve French, and two from Switzerland. Not a single American or English motor is represented in his own name, although there are tires, driving chains, and other machine parts of English origin exhibited under the names of their German agents; and three of the most noticeable and admired electrical motor carriages on exhibition are from the works of the Pops Manufacturing Company, of Hartford, and exhibited by the Motorfahrzeug und Motoren-Fabrik, of Marienfelde, a suburb of Berlin, which firm has acquired certain patents of the American company.

"As classified under the schedule previously announced, the exhibition includes forty different models and types of motor carriages for one passenger or more; thirteen exhibitors show motor wagons for freight; twenty-six numbers cover exhibits of motor cycles and trail carts belonging thereto; six firms exhibit motors and parts of the same; two show only springs and wheels for motor carriages; fifty-one firms exhibit various miscellaneous parts, fixtures, and materials for motor carriages not included in the preceding classes; and five exhibitors display the literature, drawings, maps, and models which the new science of automobilism has thus far developed.

"Large sales have been made, some of the different types having been sold as many as twenty times for future delivery; and it is noticed that for town or city use the electrical carriages have the preference among purchasers, while for country districts and parts of the delivery wagons the benzine and gasoline motors have the call. This is the natural result of considerations which apply equally in all countries. The electrical carriage is more easily handled than those of the oil or benzine type; it is self-starting, free from smell, practically noiseless, and can be run at wide ranges of speed without the use of different gear wheels; it is good for 40 miles without recharging, which is quite sufficient for ordinary city, park, or suburban driving, and can be managed by a skillful amateur without the presence and help of a professional driver.

"The hydrocarbon wagons are, on the other hand, cheaper; they require as source of power only a few quarts of benzine or gasoline that can be bought at any country store; and they can be run by any ordinary machinist who has no knowledge of electricity."


