AUTOMOBILE HACK STAND

TWENTY FINE VEHICLES NOW ON THE WAY.

Will Be put on the Streets of Honolulu To Compete with Horse Rigs—The Manager Talks.

"Early in the year we will have twenty automobile hacks on the streets of Honolulu," said Louis T. Grant who returned yesterday from the east. "The Hilo man is one of the promoters of the 'mobe' project and the new company to operate and sell the vehicles in the islands. A regular station for this purpose will be established, and a complete plant for charging the batteries put in."
"Details as to the extent of the business to be carried on are not yet complete. Much will depend on the outlook in the next few days."
"The hacks now on the way resemble the better class of hacks now on the streets, though they are more elaborate and will be more comfortable. There will be full seats for all the passengers allowed by the law. The vehicles will all be equipped with rubber tires."
"The hacks are now on the way to Honolulu. They are in pieces and will be put together by an expert after reaching here. We will doubtless be ready in January for customers."
"The charges for transporting passengers will be the same as is collected by hacks at the present time. Our speed will be eight miles an hour. A battery will run twenty-five miles, as a minimum limit, without recharging. Batteries will be changed in place of recharging at once. The delay of a vehicle will therefore be only fifteen minutes at the outside."
"I have an appliance for lifting out the batteries and installing others. This will be done at the works. The old batteries will then be recharged at leisure and laid aside for use."

MAY BE THE LAST.
The Sherman's Troops Probably Complete Otis' Reinforcements.
The commander of the transport Sherman left word here that the Forty-Ninth Infantry, which was in San Francisco on its way to the Philippines, may not be sent. The Forty-Ninth is a colored regiment, with colored officers, and has been in quarantine in San Francisco for some time owing to an outbreak of small-pox. If this regiment does not go to Manila, Honolulu has seen the last of the troops to join General Otis' command, as the Forty-Ninth was the last of the lot.
The only transports that will come through here after this, if the Forty-Ninth is held, will be those carrying horses and mules, and those which are owned by the government. The latter will continue to pass backward and forward as long as Uncle Sam is in control at the other end. Quite a number of horses and mules are said to be needed yet in the Philippines.
