AMERICA AHEAD.

Progress in Development of Military Armament.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—The fortification board has submitted its annual report to the Secretary of War, showing the progress made during the year in experimentation with weapons of war. There was a marked increase in the number of devices designed for air navigation considered during the year. Excellent results have been obtained in the development of a satisfactory high explosive and the perfection of an apparently safe method of throwing large charges of nitro-gelatine from service guns. Says the board: "It is the opinion of the board that we are now distinctly in advance of the best experimental progress in this direction abroad."
