## CARLE BROWNE FOR DEWEY

ADVOCATES HIS NOMINATION BY POPULISTS.

Says He Can Defeat Both McKinley and Bryan—Speech Delivered at Kansas City—No Enthusiasm.

KANSAS CITY, April 18.—Carl Browne of Coxe's army fame, was invited to address the morning session of the mass convention of the Middle-of-the-road Populists today, and created consternation among the adherents of Wharton Barker of Pennsylvania, when he strongly advocated Admiral Dewey as the head of the Populist national ticket. "Barker," declared Browne, in his characteristic manner, "is up against the iron wall of conditions, and defeat for him is inevitable. The head of the ticket should be the popular idol of the people, Admiral George Dewey, with Wharton Barker or Ignatius Donnelly for vice president." There was a show of stopping the speaker when he uttered these remarks, but Browne was permitted to continue. "With such a ticket," declared he, "we will stand some show of knocking out both the ticket dominated by the money power and headed by President McKinley and that headed by William J. Bryan." Silence marked the close of his address.

### THE HARTFORD.

WASHINGTON, April 13.—The first "leg" of the long voyage of the rebuilt Hartford, Farragut's famous flagship, has been made the subject of a report by her skipper, Commander Hawley, who writes from Valparaiso to the Navy Department under date of March 6th that the vessel had experienced trouble with her engines, but that he had spread his canvas liberally and made the Chilean coast without much delay. "Coming down from San Francisco," he found that the engines worked badly and frequent stops had to be made for the bearings to cool and to make necessary repairs, and at length all steam was cut off and the ship proceeded under sail power alone.

The Hartford is on her way to Hampton road with crew of 300 men, and that Commander Hawley is breaking in for ratings as ordinary seaman. More than half the crew has so far qualified, and the remainder Commander Hawley expects to have rated before he anchors in American waters.

### THE CONFERENCE COMMITTEE.

Men Who Had the Hawaiian Bill in Charge.

Four members of the conference committee on the Hawaiian bill are well known to the people of the Islands. Three of them have been heard of by Congressman Knox, by his speeches in the House on the bill, has made himself well known and well liked here. The fifth, Senator Lodge, is one of the best known men in the Senate. He is the author of the phrase, "The scholar in politics."

The sixth member is John Austin Moon of Chattanooga, Tenn., who was born April 22, 1855, in Albemarle county, Va.; removed with his father to Bristol, Va., where he resided until January, 1876, and then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where he has resided since. He was educated in the academy at Bristol, Va., and in King College, Bristol, Tenn.; studied law and was admitted to the bar at Lebanon, De Kalb county, Ala., March 16, 1874, and at Chattanooga March 16, 1874, and at the federal court and Tennessee supreme court in August, 1874, and to the bar of the fourth judicial circuit of Tennessee, was appointed special circuit judge in May, 1879, and twice reappointed, and held the office continuously under special commissions until January 3, 1891; was appointed as regular judge of the fourth circuit, and held under this commission until August 1892, when he was elected circuit judge; was re-elected in 1894 for a term of eight years; August 12, was nominated by the Democrats, and August 13, 1896, by the Populists for Congress, and was elected to the Fifty-sixth Congress, receiving 19,948 votes, against 17,718 votes for W. J. Cliff, Republican, 227 votes for J. L. Hopkins, Prohibitionist, 133 votes for W. J. Harris, Populist, and 2 votes scattering.
