THE MACDONALD'S DANGER

NARROWLY ESCAPED GOING ON THE ROCKS.

Drifted Perilously Near the Rocks at Pepeekeo Point—Rough Weather on Hawaii Coast—Hilo Harbor.

HILO, April 21.—The John McDonald, which was towed out last Monday and supposed to be fairly started on her way to New York, took several steps to the rear in the course of the day, and at 9 o'clock that evening was so close to Pepeekeo point that spectators on the bluffs above could look down upon her decks. In five minutes more she would probably have been upon the rocks with her cargo of sugar valued at over a quarter million dollars, when fortunately a puff of wind from the land came down over the high precipices and just touched her sails and held her there. In a short time the usual land night breeze set in and rapidly carried her from danger. Her precarious condition may be appreciated from the fact that she was further in shore than the Wilder steamers ever come to load plantation sugar.

The heavy northerners experienced for several days this week resulted in such rough weather all along the coast that the local steamers suspended operations entirely on Tuesday and Wednesday and sought winter quarters in Hilo bay. Even here the surface of the water reminded one of a mill pond chiefly because it was so different. At high tide the lumber of the Hilo Mercantile Company on the makai side of the yard was threatened and a large force of laborers was employed for several hours in removing it to a place of safety. So heavy a sea is rarely experienced here and the wharves and water-front were crowded with spectators during the afternoon of Wednesday. The need of a breakwater and other harbor improvements struck one even more forcibly than on other occasions. The natural advantages of the harbor are such that under ordinary conditions it is an excellent port, but the liability that any time a storm of this sort may occur renders it after all no suitable commercial port, until improved.

The captain of the Kellogg, coming ashore alone in a small boat from his vessel soon after her arrival on Thursday, was swamped in the mouth of the Waialeale. He was, however, promptly rescued by some natives who happened to be near by.

The old Hawaiian sport of surf-riding has become almost extinct of late in Hilo. During the high sea of the present week it has been revived to some extent, and on Thursday a considerable number of young Hawaiians were seen engaged in the favorite pastime of their ancestors.—Hilo Tribune.

CUSTOMS SEIZURE.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 13.—Customs Searchers Bevan and Campbell found in the forepeak of the Doric yesterday fourteen tins of opium of the finest quality, 1600 cigars and 140 silk caps that had been stowed away with the intent to smuggle them ashore. The opium was found in a teak log about three feet long and eight inches wide, hollowed out in such a way that the tins would just fit into it. The log thrown overboard would appear as a piece dropped from some wharf and could be taken ashore by a confederate of the smugglers on board the steamer. The customs officials also seized 5850 cigars on the Government transport Sheridan.
