**LEVY HAD PNEUMONIA.**

Official Report of Dr. Wood on the Subject.

The following letter has been sent by Dr. Wood to Mrs. M. S. Levy, mother of Herman Levy, who is now in the city:

Mrs. M. S. Levy, Honolulu.  
Dear Madam: Your letter of April 25, referring to your son's illness, asking for an "official and definite statement" as to the "nature of his illness," has been received at this office.  
Your son's illness was a severe broncho-pneumonia of the plague type, and probably plague origin. After a careful examination and consultation by three physicians, viz: Your son's personal physician, the Board of Health bacteriologist and the President of the Board of Health, it was decided to remove him to the plague hospital, which was done with his full consent.  
He was given a private room and furnished with a private nurse, and has expressed himself repeatedly in private and twice in public, as being entirely satisfied with his treatment.

**STRIKE AT KIHAI.**

Five Hundred Japanese Make Demands and Then Quit Work.

At last accounts 500 Japanese laborers of Kihai plantation were on a strike. They quit work last Monday after a refusal of Manager Pogue to shorten the working hours. All went over to Waiuku and the trouble was, at last accounts, before the court there. The following letter was received yesterday by Alexander & Baldwin, agents of the plantation:

"KIHAI, Maui, May 2.—All the contract Japanese on the Kihai plantation have refused to work and are under arrest in Waiuku, and the trials are going on. As far as can be learned, the men have no stated complaint, nor have they made any. It is thought the matter will be satisfactorily arranged. The majority of the men did not want to strike, and it is believed they were coerced by the leaders."  
It is stated that for some time agitators have been traveling between the plantations talking the men into striking. The Lahaina strike was the direct result of their efforts, and it is thought they have had hand in the Kihai trouble. It is said that the Japanese threatened the California well borers at Kihai and that Hugo Hanneberg, a luna discharged from Lahaina plantation, was attacked by a crowd of Japanese armed with hoes and cane knives but made his escape without injury.
