## FIRST CUSTOMS ENTRY

THE SHIP ERSKINE M. PHELPS FROM MANILA.

One of the Largest Sailing Vessels Afloat—Quarantined on Account of the Plague in Manila.

The first ship to enter her papers in the American custom house of the port of Honolulu was the American ship Erskine M. Phelps, one of the largest and finest ships afloat. She was reported early this morning, hailing from Manila, and soon after eight o'clock Captain Fuller, harbor-master, had her anchored in the stream. She is newly painted, with all masts white, and presents a splendid appearance. There is no finer wind-jammer in the world than the Erskine M. Phelps.

The Phelps comes here in ballast, to take sugar round the Horn. She can take the largest cargo of any among the sugar fleet, and last year took the biggest cargo of the year. She went from here on June 10th, with 5,115 tons of sugar in her hold. This cargo was valued at about \$450,000 and the ship is worth \$500,000, so that she represented \$950,000 as she sailed out of the harbor.

The Erskine M. Phelps was built at Bath, Maine, in 1898. She is of 2715 tons net, 2998 tons gross register, is 312 feet long and 45 feet beam.

As there is plague in Manila, the Phelps was put into quarantine by Dr. Emerson, and she lies in the stream flying a yellow flag.

## RACES THIS AFTERNOON

The races at Kapiolani park track this afternoon will begin at 2 o'clock and will have continuance until about 5:30. They will run along much as last Saturday. The band will play and it is to be expected that the crowd will be a very large one. Following are the races and the entries:

Bicycle race, purse \$50; entries close at the post.

Half mile dash, free for all; purse, \$100. Gatteline, b. m., 4, by Golden Garter-Laline, silver, grey and cardinal Maltese cross. Sir Cassimir, br. s., 4, by Elize-Nettie's Last; red and white. Maples, b. m., 4, by Teuton-Jane; Scotch plaid.

Three quarter mile dash, Hawaiian bred horses, for a purse of \$100 is not filled, there being only one entry—George Rodeck's Antidote.

Five-eighths mile dash, free for all, for purse of \$100: Verma, b. m., by Verona-Bellina, silver grey and cardinal Maltese cross. Maples, b. m., by Teuton-Jane; Scotch plaid. Allegro, the third entry, has been withdrawn.

Trotting and pacing, 2:30 class; purse \$100: Clipperson, g. m., by Grand Duke-American Girl; no colors announced. Albert M. s. g., by Illustrious-Almont; purple and black. Fred, Eros, b. g., by Eros-Nutwood; green and black cap, white suit.

One mile dash, free for all; purse \$100: Will probably not be a race as two of the three horses have been withdrawn. These are Maples and Ahuimanu, leaving only Voris in the field. A proposal has been made to fill the vacancies at the track which may be done.

Gentlemen's driving race; open to all road horses with a record and not confined to members of the Jockey club; purse \$50; entries to close at the post.

One and one-fourth mile dash, free for all; purse \$150: Aggravation, b. m., by Imp. Brutus-Gladdet; old gold sleeves and green blouse. Weller, s. s., by Netherlaiserster-Lizzie Pickwick; red and white. Eyereth, s. s., by St. Saviour-Why Not; Scotch Grand Antidote, g. s., by Senator Stanford-Poison; green and pink sash.

Pony race, one mile, everything under 14 hands; purse \$50; entries to close at the post.

**HEBREW SERVICES.**  
There will be special Jewish services at Progress Hall, corner of Fort and Beretania streets, this afternoon, at 3 o'clock, to which all who are interested are invited. There will be special prayers for the prosperity of the Territory of Hawaii and readings from the Scriptures. A number of prominent Hebrews will take part in the services.

## PLENTY OF NOISE.

The Territory of Hawaii was born at 12 o'clock last night amid the screeching of whistles and boom of fireworks in all parts of the town. Just as the second hand of the clock started on the new day the big fire whistle at the electric light house opened up and blew steadily for ten minutes. This brought hundreds of people into the streets. Bombs and sky rockets were set off, firearms were discharged into the air, and singing and hurrahs filled the town. Several steamer whistles added to the din.

The noise did not cease there. All the remainder of the night there was the rattle of fireworks. Native orchestras were out serenading. Luau's were in progress in many parts of the city, most of them beginning at 12 o'clock sharp. The native Hawaiians took more interest in the celebration than in any political demonstration since 1893.
