SAN FRANCISCO, June 13.—The Call this morning publishes the following:

"Owing to a misunderstanding four delegates at large were elected, although the allotment to Hawaii was but two. The Hawaiians were not sure of this fact, so they chose the full number. By agreement among themselves and by order of the convention which invested its delegates with representative power, should there be any controversy over the number Samuel Parker and A. N. Kopoloi are to be considered the proper and authentic representatives.

"C. B. Wilson has prepared a comprehensive paper on the conditions, political and social, existing in the Hawaiian Islands. He will ask to have it read before the convention."

The delegation leaves this evening for Philadelphia on the Overland.
