JOSEPH HELEUHE DEAD.

For Several Years Secretary to Ex-Queen Liliuokalani.

Joseph Heleuhe, for many years private secretary to Queen Liliuokalani, died at about 3 o'clock yesterday morning. Consumption was the cause of death. Deceased had suffered from this disease a very long time. The funeral took place in the afternoon, and the remains were interred in Kawaiahae cemetery.

Heleuhe was born in Kau, Hawaii, forty-five years ago, and received his education in Mr. Lyman's school at Hilo. When scarcely more than a boy he was employed by King Kalakaua as an undersecretary. He was retained in office by Liliuokalani as private secretary, and after 1895 was given charge of practically all of her affairs. On both of the trips of the ex-Queen to Washington, she was accompanied by her faithful secretary. It was he who arranged all interviews, and answered calls for the former monarch, both here and in Washington.

Deceased contracted consumption some time ago, probably in Washington. At San Francisco in May, he declined rapidly, and upon arriving in Honolulu had to be assisted to his home at Wai-kiki beach. There he sank, until Dr. English called in other physicians for a consultation. On Saturday Dr. Hoffman expressed the opinion that the patient would not last twenty-four hours longer. It was then that a trait of the deceased came out. He begged to be taken back to Washington Place to die in the presence of his queen. The procession started about 2 o'clock Sunday morning for the city, but when opposite Sam Parker's place on King street, the secretary breathed his last.

The funeral, which was held from Washington Place, was attended by the former queen and a concourse of friends.
