STAYING LAW DOMAINS

GILL LIBEL CASE THROWN OUT OF COURT.

A Broad Attack Upon the Jurisdiction Of the District Court—No Libel Law Left at All.

The Gill libel case this morning before Judge Wilcox was a battle of law points, ending with the discharge of the defendant, on the ground that the district court had jurisdiction either to try or commit, in such a case.

Among them, lawyers made out the startling contention that there is absolutely no libel law left on the statutes of the Territory of Hawaii, and Magoon and Hankey, who appeared for the defense, asked Judge Wilcox to practically declare that his court had been swept out of existence by the tide of Americanism that has engulfed the old laws.

The case began with a motion for dismissal of the writ of habeas corpus and a writ of mandamus, which was represented by attorneys Kinney, McManhan and Bigelow.

Hankey contended that libel was an infamous offense, the punishment being imprisonment, and that therefore the defendant could not be tried except upon indictment by a Grand Jury.

Judge Wilcox wanted to know if that theory did not practically put the court out of business, making it impossible for him to commit or try there, who may be imprisoned.

SQUATTERS STILL FIGHTING

WANT TO PREVENT SALE OF OLAA TRACT LANDS.

Commissioner Brown Says Territorial Act Awarded Lands to Territory and Not to Federal Government.

The fight between the Oloa squatters and the Territory for the lands of the Oloa tract, Puna district, Hawaii, is now reaching the final stages and what is expected to prove the last desperate struggle for the disposition of the land will shortly begin.

This month J. F. Brown, commissioner of public lands published a notice advertising the lands of the Oloa tract for sale in lots of 50 acres each on September 20th of this year.

Through their attorneys in Washington the squatters under the name of the American Settlers' Union propose to file an application with the Interior Department, before or by September 20th for a hearing and motion of law and equity regarding the rights of the Commissioner here to proceed with the proposed sale.
