WHO SELLS THE DRINKS? THE MYSTERY OF THE ORPHEUM LICENSE. A Complicated Arrangement That Resulted in Defeat for the Police in Court Yesterday. Judge Wilcox had a prize puzzle to solve yesterday when the Orpheum liquor case was submitted. It was the question of who ran the cafe. After all the testimony was in the judge decided that the problem was solved. It was too much mystery, and he dismissed the defendant Mitchell Chapman, who had been arrested as the man responsible for the sale of liquor alleged to have been handed out last Sunday. E. C. Macfarlane, who is the holder of the license under which the Orpheum sells to "guests", took the stand first. He didn't know who managed the Orpheum. He had nothing to do with the license, except that it was in his name. "Who is your agent to do business under this license?" was asked. Mr. Macfarlane hadn't any agent and didn't even know whether any business was being done or not. He was a director in the Orpheum company and had been selected to have the license in his name, but that was the sum and substance of all his knowledge of the affairs of the concern. "Do you know Mitchell Chapman?" asked the high sheriff. Mr. Macfarlane looked about the courtroom as if the name was a complete puzzle. He didn't know anything about Chapman. He had no idea who appointed him, or what his duties were. The holder of the Orpheum's license, which was introduced in evidence, was excused and the police had so far failed to show that Mr. Chapman ever did anything in the cafe at all. Other witnesses told of the buying of drinks under doubtful circumstances, and then the police returned to the question of who was in charge. It appeared that there so many departments intertwined and so many heads of departments with overlapping duties that no one could figure out who was to blame if the drinks had been sold. The license is in the name of Macfarlane. It is turned over to a corporation, and the directors of the corporation have their agents. This much was brought out clearly, but there was no proof that Chapman had anything to do with selling drinks, though some witnesses testified that he was in charge of the cafe sometimes. Judge Wilcox threw the case out of court on the ground that no proof had been made of Chapman's responsibility, even if drinks were furnished for people who were not guests.

OLIVIER A PRISONER. Capture of the Boer General and His Three Sons. LONDON, August 27.—The War Office has received the following dispatch from Lord Roberts: "The Boers have been beaten back by Bruce Hamilton at Winburg. General Olivier has been captured. The text of Lord Roberts's dispatch from Belfast under today's date announcing the capture of General Olivier shows that three of Olivier's sons also were captured in the attack which the Boers made from three sides on Winburg. Lord Roberts adds that General Olivier was "the moving spirit among the Boers in the southeast portion of the Orange Colony during the war."
