WAS IT A FROST?

Conflicting Reports of the Big Indianapolis Convention.

This is what the Republican papers say of it:

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Oct. 3.—Like the play of "Hamlet" with the melancholy Dane omitted the convention of Democratic Clubs of the United States came to order here this afternoon without the inspiring presence of its chairman and chief promoter, William R. Hearst of New York, Chicago and San Francisco. Mr. Hearst must have got wind of the miserable failure of his efforts to induce a crowd to come to Indianapolis, for he not only failed to come but gave no reason for such a failure. The only explanation of Mr. Hearst's extraordinary absence was attempted by Senator James K. Jones, chairman of the Democratic National Committee, who said that Mr. Hearst had been unavoidably detained from this meeting. The convention was called to order by Senator Jones, who in a brief address turned the direction of the body over to the temporary officers chosen: Chairman, Thomas Taggart, Mayor of Indianapolis; secretary, Max Ihmsen, Washington correspondent of the New York Journal; sergeant at arms, Myron D. King, a well-known local Democratic politician.

This is what the Democratic papers say:

INDIANAPOLIS, (Ind.), October 3.—Three thousand five hundred delegates were seated in Tomlinson Hall when the greatest convention known in the history of the National Association of Democratic Clubs was called to order. About them, thronging the galleries, four thousand people cheered for Bryan and Stevenson and Democracy. Those seven thousand had come to Indianapolis from all sections of the United States. They represented States from Maine to California, and they brought the rallying cry, "All for Bryan!" This the quadrennial convention of the National Association, eclipses every former meeting in the history of the organization.


