IN THE ENEMY'S COUNTRY

BRYAN MAKES SPEECHES ALL OVER OHIO.

Everywhere He Has Big Crowds and Is Received With Much Enthusiasm—At McKinley's Own Home.

CLEVELAND (O.), October 15.—William J. Bryan arrived here at 5:40 o'clock this evening and later addressed two large audiences in this city, one at Central Armory and the other from the balcony of the Hollenden Hotel. He was greeted upon his entrance into the city by the blowing of whistles and was met at the station by a number of marching clubs and brass bands, which formed his escort to the Hollenden, where he took dinner. The streets of the city were brilliantly lighted and were lined with people.

Bryan today invaded the heart of President McKinley's and Senator Hanna's country. Leaving Akron early in the morning his first stop was at Canton, the President's place of residence, and later in the day he made a brief speech at Niles, the President's native city. At night he spoke at Cleveland, Mr. Hanna's home. The stops at Canton and Niles were not incidental and the crowds were small at both places.

The only important day meetings were those at New Philadelphia and Youngstown. At New Philadelphia there was a big attendance and the meeting was an enthusiastically one. There were two meetings at Youngstown, one in the public square and the other at the opera house.

Bryan spoke twice in Youngstown, first in the public square and then in the opera house. His experience at the open-air meeting strikingly illustrated the futility of getting together excessively large crowds for a political meeting. In the one important respect of attracting many people to see the national candidate the meeting was an unsurpassed triumph; in the other respect of giving people an opportunity to hear him, it was a failure, and the success one way was the cause of the failure the other. People had been coming into the city from Ohio and Pennsylvania all day, so that when Mr. Bryan arrived, at 4:30 in the afternoon, all the principal streets were crowded and the square around the speaker's stand, possibly 400 feet on each side, was densely packed with people struggling to get near the platform and to secure a glimpse of the speaker.

BIGELOW RESIGNS.
R. W. Atkinson Appointed to Complete Sugar Schedule Work.

George Bigelow, Special Agent of the Twelfth census for Hawaii, has resigned to accept a business connection with Harry Von Holt and Cecil Brown. Since the completion of the population enumeration Mr. Bigelow has been engaged in collecting the special statistics of the sugar industry, called for by the Director of the Census, General Merriam.

R. W. Atkinson has been appointed to complete the work of collecting these statistics. It is expected it will require about a month yet. Mr. Atkinson left yesterday on the Kinau for Hawaii to prosecute this work.

THE SHRINERS.
Prince David's Luau, Reception Aboard the Zealandia Tonight.

The reception and luau to the Shriners given yesterday afternoon by Prince David at his Waikiki residence was thoroughly enjoyable, despite the unfavorable weather. The luau was served in Hawaiian style and included almost every known Hawaiian dainty. Following the luau there was a hula hula given for the entertainment of the visitors.

Queen Liliuokalani was present during the reception. In the evening there was dancing on the lanais of the Hawaiian Hotel. This evening the Shriners will tender a reception aboard the Zealandia to their friends ashore. Every master mason and his ladies are invited. The Zealandia will sail at 4 o'clock tomorrow afternoon.
