

USBORNE AND THE "BULL"

RECTOR OF ST. CLEMENT'S AND BISHOP.

Protests the Loyalty of St. Clement's to the Anglican Church But Denounces Alleged Episcopal Usurpation

EDITOR STAR: In your issue of this afternoon you have published two letters which have been signed by the Bishop of Honolulu, in which his Lordship makes the statement that I have separated myself from the Anglican church and have founded a new sect called "The Episcopal Church at Large."

These defamatory letters I am informed have been freely circulated in America and England.

It is unfortunate that our unhappy church should be once more scandalized by its chief officer.

This is a very serious charge to make against any clergyman, and it is so self evidently untrue and seems so absurd as to be almost unworthy of contradiction. Yet for the benefit of strangers in our city, who do not know the Bishop, it is right that a most emphatic and unqualified denial of both charges should be made, which I now make.

Both these statements are utterly untrue and without foundation are incomprehensible, if not inspired by feelings of retaliation.

St. Clement's congregation, its officers and myself are, and always have been, as loyal to the Anglican church and to the lawful administration of its Episcopal authority, as any church, and we cordially invite any one to attend our services that he may judge for himself.

It is quite true that the Bishop has refused to acknowledge St. Clement's as a church of his diocese, but this is only because the trustees, (whom you all know as the most honorable of men) for good and lawful reasons have ever refused to transfer the Trust of property to his Lordship.

The Bishop has on several occasions expressed himself as ready at any time to acknowledge St. Clement's as soon as the trustees would transfer the property, but the canon law of this diocese does not require such transfer, and therefore, the trustees, who have best reasons for retaining the control of the property itself in their own hands, have refused to transfer it.

They have in no way, nor have I, ever disputed the exercise of the Bishop's lawful authority or spiritual jurisdiction in this church; on the contrary, we have always and do now, invite it, but his Lordship will not exercise it, since he cannot control the property itself in a church in conformity to the law. The fact of the Bishop's falling in his duty cannot reflect upon the loyalty of St. Clement's.

It is simply a question of real estate, in which doctrine, church principle, or churchmanship does not enter.

I am now preparing a full refutation of these accusations which I shall be glad to send to any of your readers who may be interested when I receive it from press.

In the meantime I repeat both these charges are absolutely groundless, and are as untrue as they are malicious, and simply another phase of his persecution of myself.

Notice to Shippers.

In accordance with Sections 4472, 4475 and 4476 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, the undersigned hereby gives notice to all shippers, that the following articles will not be carried on any of their passenger steamers, viz:

Loose hay, loose cotton, loose hemp, giant powder, nitroglycerine, naphtha, benzene, benzole, coal-oil, crude petroleum or other like explosive burning fluids, or like dangerous articles, oil of vitriol, nitric or other chemical acids.

Refined petroleum which will not ignite at a temperature less than 119 degrees Fahrenheit will be received, also oil or spirits of turpentine when put up in good metallic vessels, or casks or barrels well and securely bound with iron. Friction matches must also be securely packed in strong tight chests or boxes, the covers of which shall be well secured by locks, screws, or other reliable fastenings; and all these articles must be packed or put up separately from each other, and from all other articles; and the package, box, cask, or other vessel containing the same shall be distinctly marked on the outside with the name or description of the article contained therein.

FAILURE TO DO THIS WILL RENDER THE SHIPPER LIABLE TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING EIGHTEEN MONTHS, OR BOTH.

Gunpowder will only be taken on the following named passenger steamers,

under special license, viz.: Steamers "Mauna Loa," "W. G. Hall," "Hana- lei," "Iwaliani," "Noanoa," and "James Makee."

Shippers are also notified that freight will only be received upon the following conditions, viz:

That the carrier shall not be liable for loss or damage, occasioned by causes beyond its control, by the perils of the sea or other waters, by fire from any cause or wheresoever occurring, by barratry of the master or crew, by enemies, pirates or robbers, by arrest and restraint of governments or people, riots, strikes or stoppage of labor, by explosion, bursting of boilers, breakage of shafts or any latent defect in hull, machinery or appurtenances, by collisions, stranding or other accidents of navigation of whatsoever kind.
