



WINSLOW WAS SICK. Case Was Continued by Judge Wilcox This Morning.

Charge of assault and battery against Dr. Winslow and Miss Mudge the principal of the school at Waiakole, were called in Judge Wilcox's court this morning. Winslow was not in court.
