THE DIAMOND HEAD.

WAILUKU, March 15.—The bark Diamond Head, Capt. A. Peterson arrived at Kuanapali on Thursday morning, March 15, 41 days out from Seattle with cargo of Black Diamond coal for the Pioneer Plantation, an unusually long voyage, caused by the stormy weather. She was running very low in provisions, some of her supply having been damaged by water, and for the last ten days of her voyage a tobacco famine prevailed on board.

EGBERT GOT NO MAIL.

Postal Authorities Thought Alameda Would Make up Time.

The transport Egbert sailed for San Francisco yesterday afternoon at 5 o'clock. No mail was sent on her as it was decided to hold the mail until the Alameda which will sail next Wednesday afternoon. Captain Williamson the depot quartermaster, expressed the opinion that the Alameda would reach San Francisco at practically the same time as, if not before, the Egbert, so it was decided to hold the mail for the transport.

It was feared that the Egbert would take at least 9 to 10 days to make the run, while the Alameda will go up in less than 6 days. It took the Egbert 23 days to come here from Manila, estimating her speed on this showing, she will certainly not take any 9 or 10 days to go to San Francisco. She ought to get up in 5 days which will put her into port a day ahead of the Alameda.

There was a good sized crowd at the wharf yesterday to see the transport sail. The police searched the vessel for smugglers. Five white men were secured and escorted ashore. One of them waited his chance and when the vessel was moving out of the Naval slip, climbed up one of the forward lines, hand over hand and was spirited away by the men aboard.

The reason for searching the transport was to prevent any possibility of Woods, the negro convict escaping from the island. No trace of the man was discovered so it is thought by the au-

thorities that he did not get aboard and is still at large on Oahu.
