SHIPPING ON KAUAL.

Purser Friel of the steamer W. G. Hall which arrived from Kauai yesterday reports that the barkentine Hawaii sailed from Makawell last Saturday for San Francisco. The barkentine Lahaina was still discharging coal at Elelee and was expected to sail on Tuesday. The bark W. B. Flint was discharging at Makawell and will begin taking sugar today for San Francisco.

SUGAR ON KAUAL.

The following sugar is reported on Kauai: K. S. M., 2500 bags; V. K., 400 bags; Diamond W., 300 bags; Mak., 2,250 bags; G. & R., 4900 bags; total, 10,600 bags.

SOLANO BROUGHT COAL.
The schooner Solano arrived this morning from Newcastle with 1735 tons of coal for Castle and Cooke. She left the day previous to the ship William H. Smith and her captain tried to make a short voyage and beat the other vessel, but failed to do so.

ENCOUNTERED BAD WEATHER.
The steamer Noeau arrived at Honolulu and Kukuhaele last Tuesday. There was such a strong swell running that Captain Mosher did not attempt to load the Kukuhaele rollers aboard his vessel. The ordinary freight was taken however, over 2,000 sacks of sugar being brought to this port Saturday evening.

BROUGHT RICE PADDY.
The schooner Ka Mol arrived this morning at 3 o'clock from Hamakua ports. She brought 1,500 sacks of rice paddy. The vessel has been away much longer than usual. The weather was quite rough along the Hamakua coast at times last week.

BROUGHT CONSIDERABLE STOCK.
The gasoline schooner Eclipse arrived Sunday afternoon from her run to Hawaii, Maui and Molokai ports. She brought 50 head of cattle and 100 head of sheep.

PURSER BELLAINE MARRIED.
SUVA, Fiji, October 15.—A quiet little wedding took place last Tuesday evening at the residence of M. Dods, Esq., Chief Police Magistrate, when F. Bellaine, Esq., the popular purser of R. M. S. Aorangi, was united in wedlock to Miss Dods of Canada, a recent arrival to the colony and a niece to Mr. Dods. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Thompson, and many friends were present for the occasion amongst whom was Captain Phillips of the Aorangi. The happy couple proceeded next morning in the Aorangi to Sydney.—Fiji Times.

COPTIC EXPECTED TOMORROW.
It is more than likely that the S. S. Coptic will arrive tomorrow about 1 p. m. from San Francisco with five days later mail and news from there. She is not due until Wednesday, but invariably arrives the day ahead of time. She will sail some time Wednesday for the Orient and Manila.

MIOWERA WAS LATE.

The S. S. Miowera did not arrive in port from the South until late Saturday afternoon. She left Sydney October 8, and Brisbane October 11, Suva October 17. Light unsteady breezes and smooth seas were experienced during most of the trip. Pursued Bellmaine the regular officer of the boat remained in Sydney to undergo an operation. The vessel shortly after 6 o'clock yesterday morning. She took about twenty passengers from this port.

LITTLE SUGAR ON HAWAII.

Admiral Beckley, purser of the steamer Claudine reports the following sugar left on Hawaii: Waiakoa, 2,600 bags; Waiakoa, 15,500; Paaubau, 3,000; Punaiau, 3,500; Honuapu, 5,000.

GALE OFF IRELAND.

LONDON, October 16.—A gale which began yesterday swept over the coasts all night long. The Norwegian bark Bengal broke away from a tug on the high seas and was totally wrecked near White haven. The crew were rescued by the rocket brigade.
The British steamer Heraclides, from Rosario, for Liverpool, was driven ashore in the Mersey channel, and it is expected will be a total wreck. Thirty nine of her crew were rescued. The cook was drowned.

PISTOL PRACTICE.

Actual "face to face" pistol practice is now possible. Dr. Devilless of Parole, France, has invented a wax bullet which may be used in a 44-caliber Smith & Wesson shell. The only protection necessary in this mock duelling is a safe screen for the eyes. Encounters with the wax bullet are both amusing and instructive.

MAGNETIC ISLANDS.

The tales of magnetic islands, which lure vessels to destruction by affecting their compasses, turns out to be founded on fact. The island of Housholm, the property of Denmark, and in the Baltic sea near the Prussian coast, has this property. The island is a vast magnet whose influence is perceptible through a radius of 10 miles.
