CONVICTED OF BURGLARY.
Jose Regi, a Porto Rican, was found guilty of burglary yesterday afternoon and Judge Robinson sentenced him to two years and six months at hard labor. Regi tried to break into a store at the corner of King street and the Walkiki road. He was caught in the act, the inmates of the building being aroused by the fall of a bar which was crossed the door way.

VERDICTS OF NOT GUILTY.
Yong Tai, charged with assault and battery, and August Ricardo charged with selling liquor without a license, were acquitted yesterday in Judge Robinson's court.

CONTRACTS LET.
Superintendent Cooper yesterday let a contract to C. P. Benton for section number 1 of the road from Pahala to the Volcano road, for \$17,529.60, also for the Ahulua, Hamakua road, at \$19,000. Whitehouse & Hawxhurst were awarded the contract for the new bridge over the Kailihual river, Kauai, the price being \$6,700.

SMITH'S ANNUAL REPORT.
The annual report of Jared Smith, of the United States Agricultural Experiment Station, has been published by the Department of Agriculture at Washington. It contains a general review of the year's work and discusses the small-farming products of the islands.

UNIT OF VALUATION.
EDITOR STAR: About fifty years ago an insurance company of Liverpool determined to erect a building on the corner of Dale street and the eastern entrance to the Liverpool Exchange. They purchased land of sufficient quantity, paying therefor at the rate of \$80 or \$400 per square foot. This valuation may be represented by a layer of silver dollars covering the property a little over six deep. Now, applying this to a lot 25x100 (size of ground), the value is \$1,000,000, or, as we estimate, \$40,000 per front foot; as that purchase was made over fifty years ago, and values have rapidly increased in Liverpool, a front foot must be worth now much more than \$100,000.

When prices reach this high point each individual foot has a value actual and independent of its location, front or interior on property suitable for building.

In determining value therefore, it is necessary that a fixed and invariable measure shall be taken as a unit; this must embrace the component elements

of surface (the available portion of real property).

Were our lots of approximate uniformity in depth and regularity of boundaries the present system would be practicable, but such an irregularity of outline exists that a uniform unit of measurement becomes an absolute necessity and as values continue to increase the demand will be more urgent. In no other way than by the superficial unit can values be comparative and comprehensible.

Some concerted action should be inaugurated on the part of agents to embody this system in the conduct of their business; it must come eventually and be the ruling guide, as it is in the cities of the East and Europe and as recognized and practiced here in some legal controversies.

THE RED CROSS.

WASHINGTON, April 28.—The twenty-three suspended members of the National Red Cross Society have issued to the public a statement showing the legal status, as they view it, of the executive committee of the society, which suspended them, and their own position. The meeting appointed a special committee, consisting of Simon Wolf, Hilary A. Herbert, Ex-Secretary of the Navy; Miss Mabel T. Boardman, Mrs. J. Ellen Foster and B. H. Warner, to collate all the facts at their command to show the 'abuses that have been practiced by the old management and the unbusinesslike manner in which the finances have been collected and disbursed.'

Another statement embodying the results of this special committee's work will be made public later.
