## KAMEHAMEHA DAY RACES

HAWAIIAN STAR'S TURF RECORD.

Numbers are of events beginning with the Kapiolani Park Races June 11 and 14, 1902

June meet of the Hawaiian Jockey Club, Kapiolani Park, Honolulu, Thursday, June 11, 1903. Judges, C. H. Durfee, J. C. Cluney, Frank Halstead; Clerk, T. V. King; Starter, Charles B. Wilson; Timekeepers, J. L. Torbet, W. F. Love, C. J. Willis; Clerk of Course, T. P. Cummins; Saddling Paddock, Lawrence H. Dee. Officers of the Club: D. P. R. Isenberg, president; Edgar Halstead, vice-president; G. P. Wilder, treasurer; C. L. Crabbe, secretary. Directors, W. H. Hoogs, Prince David Kawananakoa, J. C. Quinn, C. L. Crabbe. Races under the rules of the California Jockey Club and the National Trotting Association.

Large attendance both morning and afternoon, in the grandstand and in private vehicles inside the track. Fine weather with only a sprinkle of rain and track in good condition. No records broken. Cyclone in two trials failing to beat Waldo J's record of a mile in 2:13. Cyclone made 2:13 1-5, against time. On the first breakaway Cyclone went to the half in 1:05, and to the seven-eighths in 1:55, which should have meant home better than 2:12, but within the last furlong the game animal made a break and lost the stride, coming under the wire in 2:17.

Quinn; Oak Grove, brown geld., 6 years, by Dexter Prince, dam Odette, 150 lbs. Sambo won three heats, leading all the way each time, in 2:25 1/2, 2:24 1/2 and 2:24 1-5. Oak Grove distanced in first heat. Wayboy second in first and third heats, Los Angeles in second heat.

- 22 Trotting and pacing, 2:30 class, best 2 in 3 heats, purse \$200. Billy Lemp, 150 lbs., bay gelding, aged, sire Dawn, dam Wilkes, mare, C. H. Bellina; Jim Jeffries, 150 lbs., b. g., 6 years, sire Acrobat, dam Negress, Charles A. Gault; Artie W., 150 lbs., b. g., aged, sire Don Maroin, dam Viola, Captain Soule; Eva M., 150 lbs., b. g., aged, sire Dexter Prince, dam Lucy, J. J. Belsler; Oak Grove, 150 lbs., b. g., 6 years, sire Dexter Prince, dam Odette, D. H. Lewis, Billy Lemp (Bellina) won two heats. Jim Jeffries led all through first heat with Oak Grove striving hard for second up to three-fourths; Billy Lemp second, time 2:28. Jeffries led half of second heat and was then left by Billy Lemp, time 2:26. In third heat Billy Lemp led all the way Jim Jeffries coming in second, while Oak Grove galloped to second; time, 2:27.

Weller, 126 lbs., sorrel stallion, aged, sire Netherclerster, dam Lizzie Pickwick, Prince D. Kawananakoa; Carter Harrison, Jr., 123 lbs., bay gelding, aged, sire Imp. Watercress, dam Lucile Murphy, John O'Rourke; Racine Murphy, 123 lbs., roan gelding, 6 years, sire Racine, dam Maggie R., W. Lucas. Racine Murphy led all the way, while Weller and Carter Harrison kept close for three-quarters, when Carter Harrison crept close to Racine Murphy but did not press the latter very hard.
- 25 Special race against time. Purse \$250 if track record is beaten. Two trials with running mate, Cyclone, 150 lbs., blk. gelding, aged breeding unknown, G. Schuman. Effort to beat Waldo J's 2:13 flat. First time, 2:17; second time, 2:13 1-5. The time by eighths first heat was: .17; .34; .49; 1.05; 1.21 1/2; 1.38; 1.55; 2:17; second heat eighths were: .17; .34; .50 4-5; 1:07 1-5; 1:34 1/2; 1.41; 1:55; 2:13 1-5.
- 26 Trotting and pacing, California Feed Co.'s Cup, Hawaiian bred. Purse \$200, best 2 out of 3. Leahy, 150 lbs., blk. g., 6 years, sire Creole, dam Geister, T. Hollinger; Madeline, 150 lbs., b. m., 5 years, sire Creole, dam Nancy Lee, T. W. Lishman; Thelma, 150 lbs., br. m., 6 years, sire Creole, dam Maud, Paul R. Isenberg. Thelma (Quinn) easily led both heats, Madeline (Gibson) trying bravely and making second place both times. Time, 2:34, 2:26.
- 27 Union Feed Co.'s Cup. Pony race. Thirteen hands and under. Entries close June 11th at race track with secretary. Post entries. Kitty, W. Macfarlane, first; Pat, T. Hollinger, second; Kauai Girl, G. King, third. Time, 48 seconds. One Ear and Makaha Boy also ran. Winner, black pony, aged. Good start. Kitty led all way, though others changed positions frequently. Master Holt on Mahaha Boy making hard drive but ending last.
- 28 Gentlemen's driving race, Rapid Transit Co.'s Cup, to be won twice. Artie W., Captain Soule; Eva M., J. J. Belsler; Los Angeles, M. H. Drummond; Abndine, W. H. Smith; Faro Bank, W. Lucas; Wait-a-Little, E. V. Richardson. Faro Bank won in 2:23 1/2, leading all the way. Abndine only approaching once. Wait-a-Little broke early and was never in it.
- 29 Scrub race, half mile dash. No race horse allowed. Cup valued at \$25. Post entries. Kauai Girl, G. B. King; Maui Boy, T. J. K. Evans; Dick Mud, Boyd; Peninsula Boy, Fernandez; Maluhia, Vida. Dick Mud won, Peninsula Boy, second; Maluhia third. Time .56 2-15.
- 30 Winner D. B. Maconachie's black gelding. Good start. Winner never headed; field well separated; finish in drive; second horse two lengths back.
- 30 Polo Pony Race, Three-eighths mile dash. Cup value, \$25. Entries close June 11, at race track with secretary. Honi Kaula, P. L. Rice; Dick Mud, Gypsey, Hakelani and others. Dick Mud first, Gypsey second, Hakelani third; time 41. Straggling start, Dick Mud got a good breakaway and went all the way ahead, though challenged strong by Gypsey in the stretch.

Moir's Dixie Land won in 2:40 without ever losing the lead. Carter Harrison, Jr., made second place.
