PUBLIC UTILITIES. The proposal to put up the Kohala Ditch franchise at public auction is in accordance with the latest tendencies in government in dealing with public utilities.

There has often been excuse and indeed justification for these extensive grants of public domain or public rights, in the necessity for generous treatment to induce the necessary capital to go into enterprises requiring public franchises.

In view of the tendency throughout the Anglo-Saxon world for the municipal ownership of public utilities, there ought to be some provision in the Kohala Ditch franchise for its purchase by the Territory or some of its political sub-divisions.

RENAN AND BRITTANY.

The clerical demonstrations carried out in Brittany against Premier Combes when he went thither recently, to unveil the memorial to Renan, gives special interest to Renan's own description of his native village.

Treguer, my native village, is an ancient monastery, founded in the latter years of the fifth century by Saint Tudwal or Tual, one of the religious chiefs of those great migrations which carried into the Armorican peninsula the race and the religious institutions of Great Britain.

Monasteries, in the Breton tongue were called pabu, from the name of the monks (papae). The monastery of Treguer was thus called Pabu Tual.

When Nomenoe, in the ninth century organized for the first time in regular manner, this society of semi-savage immigrants, and created the Duchy of Brittany by adding to the country which spoke Breton the Earldom of Brittany, established by the Carolingians to maintain their authority in the west, he felt the need of extending to his duchy the religious organization of the rest of the world.
