CHINA UNLOADS RUSSIAN BEEF.

RUSSIANS MASSACRE CHINESE. Associated Press, Morning Service. TIENTSIN, February 26.—The Russians have burned a large Chinese village on the Sungari river and massacred the inhabitants, including women.
