LOCAL EXAMINATIONS WILL BE HELD FOR ELIGIBLES IN FOUR CLASSES OF EMPLOYMENT.

Civil Service Examinations will be held on dates as indicated below. Further information may be obtained by consulting Mr. Kenake or Mr. McCoy at the postoffice, by consulting Mr. Short, Mr. Wilder or Mr. Ingalls at the custom house, or by consulting Prof. W. D. Alexander of the Coast and Geodetic Survey.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces an examination on June 1-2, 1904, to secure eligibles from which to make certification to fill vacancies as they may occur in the position of Assistant to Inspector of Ordnance.

The examination will consist of the subjects mentioned below, weighted as indicated:

Table with 2 columns: Subjects and Weights. 1. Arithmetic and practical geometry 15, 2. Penmanship 5, 3. Letter writing 10, 4. Drawing 15, 5. Practical questions 30, 6. Training and experience 25

Total 100. The subject of training and experience will be rated on the submitted application before the date of the examination, and only those applicants who receive a rating of 70 or more on this subject will be admitted to the examination.

Age limit, 20 years or over. This examination is open to all citizens of the United States who comply with the requirements.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces an examination at Honolulu, Hawaii on June 8, 1904, to secure eligibles from which to make certification to fill twelve vacancies in the position of watchman in the Immigration Service at Honolulu, Hawaii, at \$3 per diem each, and other similar vacancies as they may occur in that service there.

Qualified persons are urged to enter this examination. The examination will consist of the subjects mentioned below, weighted as indicated:

The United States Civil Service Commission announces an examination on June 8, 1904 to secure eligibles from which to make certification to fill a vacancy in the position of civil engineer, Bureau of Forestry, Philippine Service, at \$2,400 per annum, and other similar vacancies as they may occur in that service.

The examination will consist of the subjects mentioned below, weighted as indicated:

TWO FESTIVALS OF CHORAL MUSIC

A MODIFIED EISTEDFOD IS TO BE GIVEN NEXT WEEK—OPERA HOUSE AND BOYS FIELD.

The first music festival to be held next week will be the beginning of a music epoch of no little importance to the Islands. That it will be a tremendous success is easy to foretell by the excellent manner in which preparations have developed and it has taken on proportions beyond the most sanguine expectations of those at its head.

The event will be in two parts, both widely different in character. The first, or "Congress of Song" will be heard at Hawaiian Opera House next Friday evening and will be in the form of oratorios of very high merit. In it a chorus of three hundred voices will give a perfect rendition standard choral music, every voice trained for the part and the whole harmoniously balanced for the finest effect. This grand chorus will be under the directorship of Prof. Gerald Barton of Oahu College while separate sections will be under the leadership of Miss Byington, Kamehameha Girls' School; Mrs. Yarnley, High School; Mrs. Tucker, Normal School; Miss Coolege, Kawaiahae; Stanley Livingston, Kamehameha Manual and Mr. Merrill, Mills' Institute. The following will be the program:

Tickets have been selling rapidly for this event and the box office will open at Wall, Nichols Co., Monday morning for exchange for reserve seats. To prevent speculation the management has made a rule that not more than ten tickets will be exchanged for each person and this will meet with general approval.

The second event is a song competition among the children to be held in the Boys' Field in Liliha street Saturday afternoon. Six hundred children from the grammar school grades will be assembled
