**THE KINCHOW FIGHT**

Washington, May 27, 1904.  
Received at the Japanese Consulate at 3 p. m. on the same day.  
To SAITO:—The commander of the army attacking Kinchow reports as follows:

May 21, our observation and the enemy's cannonading showed that the enemy had at Nanshan hill, south of Kinchow, four 15-centimetre shrapnel, ten 9 to 15-centimetre cannons (ten 5-centimetre shells proved range of 8500 metres), twenty 12-centimetre quick-firing guns, besides at least ten forts. The foothills were with bomb-proofs and mines.

May 22, our attacking force commenced operation as prearranged. May 23, our reconnaissance discovered the enemy's right wing on Huashangtao, with about eight heavy guns facing the sea. The fragments of the enemy's shells showed 20-centimetre guns, 15-centimetre short cannons, 10 1-2 or 8-centimetre cannons and 7-centimetre quick-firers. The small bodies of the enemy's infantry and artillery were observable staying at Kinchow.

In the morning of the 25th of May we attacked Kinchow and engaged with the enemy's artillery at Nanshan.

On May 26, at dawn, we commenced cannonading lasting five hours, while three Japanese warships assisted from Kinchow Bay. A Russian gunboat attacked our left flank from Taitienwan. We took Kinchow at 5:10 a. m. and after a severe fight occupied Nanshan, pursuing the enemy.  
TAKAHIRA.

Washington, May 27, 1904.  
Received at the Japanese Consulate at 4 p. m. on the same day.  
To SAITO:—The detailed report of the attack of Kinchow reads as follows:

"The enemy built several covered trenches around the forts of Nanshan and offered stubborn resistance under strong defense works. Nevertheless after several attempts we finally succeeded in taking the enemy's position by storm, driving the enemy towards Nanshan. This severe fight continued sixteen hours.

"Admiral Togo telegraphs that a captain commanding our detached fleet consisting of four gunboats and torpedo flotillas reports by wireless telegraph that our fleet reached Kinchow Bay and, co-operating with our army, bombarded Nanshan on the 26th of May and upon witnessing our army occupy Nanshan forts withdrew. Captain Shokai was killed and nine others were killed and wounded. Damage to our ships is insignificant.  
TAKAHIRA."

**JAPANESE BATTLESHIP ALLEGED SUNK.**

NEWCHWANG, May 28.—The Russians declare that a Japanese battleship has been sunk by a submarine.  
LONDON, May 28.—The Russian casualties at Kinchow were greater than the enemy's.

**JAPANESE DECLARES BLOCKADE.**

CHEFOO, May 28.—Japan declares the entire coast line of the Liaoting Peninsula, from south of Peizewo to Pulantien, effectively blockaded.  
This blockade encloses the entire southern section of the Peninsula including Port Arthur, up to a line across the north shore of Society Bay on the west, the coast line indicated being a length of, say, 200 to 300 miles.

**JAPANESE NEAR PORT ARTHUR.**

LONDON, May 28.—The Japanese are within twelve miles of Port Arthur.

**CHINESE WAR PARTY CLAMOROUS.**

PEKING, May 28.—The Chinese war party is strenuously urging the Government to abandon neutrality. The Government is awaiting Manchurian developments.

**PRESBYTERIAN UNION.**

BUFFALO, N. Y., May 28.—The Presbyterian General Assembly has voted in favor of union with the Cumberland Presbyterians.
