The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m., which is the same as Greenwich, 2 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and moon are for local time for the whole group.

ORLOFF BLAMED

Associated Press, Morning Service. ST. PETERSBURG, September 15.—General Kuropatkin's official report attributes the loss of Liaoyang to Gen. Orloff's failure to hold a vital point. Kuropatkin estimates the Russian losses in the battle at 4000 killed and 12,000 wounded. The report restores Kuropatkin's prestige here.

JAPAN'S VOLUNTEER FLEET. Associated Press, Morning Service. TOKIO, September 15.—Japan has decided to organize a fleet to protect the national shipping. The expense will be borne by public subscription.

MAINE'S OFFICIAL RETURNS. Associated Press, Morning Service. PORTLAND, Me., September 15.—The Republican plurality in Maine, officially reported is 27,130.

WHY McWADE WAS REMOVED. Associated Press, Morning Service. OYSTER BAY, September 15.—Consul General McWade of Canton has been removed from office because of irregularities in the issuance of Chinese certificates and excessive fees.

Robert M. McWade, as Consul at Canton, had the largest territory of any American consul. It contains a population of 80,000,000, all of the treaty ports being under his jurisdiction. The territory consists of the three provinces, Kwansatung, Kwansi and Yunnan. For several years he has been in trouble with other American consuls in the Orient and charges and countercharges have been flying thick and fast to Washington. About everything out of the way that a consul could be charged with has been marked up to McWade by the other consuls. McWade is unpopular in the American community at Canton. Last year he distinguished himself by kicking the vice-consul out of his office.

His removal from the Canton consulate may be traced to the report that Herbert H. D. Pierce, third assistant Secretary of State made to the President on his return to Washington within the past few weeks, after having investigated all of the American consulates in the Orient and particularly the United States establishment at Canton.

COLORADO REPUBLICANS. Associated Press, Morning Service. DENVER, September 15.—The Republicans have renominated Peabody for Governor.

AGAINST CHURCH POLITICS. Associated Press, Morning Service. SALT LAKE, September 15.—An American party has been organized here to oppose church politics.
