

**NEWS BY CABLE**

**PRISONERS TO KURE ISLAND.** TOKIO, Jan. 8.—Twenty thousand Russian prisoners will be brought to Kure, the island naval station of Japan in the Inland Sea. Those who are most seriously sick or wounded will remain at Port Arthur.

**BUYING GIFTS BETWEEN BATTLE.** MUKDEN, Jan. 8.—The city is filled with Russian officers and soldiers buying Christmas gifts. They declare that the troops in the camps and defenses are well fed and clothed.

**REBUILDING CZAR'S NAVY.** PARIS, Jan. 8.—The Russian naval program contemplates an outlay of \$200,000,000 to rehabilitate the war marine.

**NO LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM YET.** WASHINGTON, Jan. 8.—The President has conferred with the leaders of Congress about important legislation but no conclusion was reached. The Army appropriation bill, when completed, will call for \$69,000,000.

**CHORUS GIRLS HURT.** NEW YORK, Jan. 8.—Twenty chorus girls were injured last night by the collapse of a bridge over a street in a scene from Carmen.

**PORTLAND OFFICIALS SAFE.** PORTLAND, Or., Jan. 8.—The indictments of the mayor and chief of police have been withdrawn.

**STORM ON GERMAN COAST.** BERLIN, Jan. 8.—A storm on the north coast has caused heavy damage.

**WILL CONTINUE THE WAR.** ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 8.—The Emperor has held a conference with the Council of the Empire. His decision is that the Government will continue the war.

**REPORTED JAPANESE REPULSE.** ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 9.—General Kuropatkin has reported that an attempt of the Japanese to surprise his center was frustrated.

**STOESSEL GOES HOME VIA SUEZ.** TOKIO, Jan. 9.—Generals Fock and Smyrnoff and Admiral Witen will be taken to Japan, together with fifty per cent of the Russian officers, as voluntary prisoners. The total of Port Arthur prisoners comprises 878 officers and 23,491 men. General Stoessel returns to Russia via Suez.

**PORT ARTHUR NAVAL STATION.** TOKIO, Jan. 9.—Port Arthur is to be made a naval station. The work of clearing the harbor of mines is proceeding.

**ANOTHER JAPANESE LOAN.** TOKIO, Jan. 9.—The fourth Japanese domestic loan will soon be floated.

**FORMER GOVERNOR DEAD.** BALTIMORE, Jan. 9.—Former Governor Lowndes is dead.

Lloyd Lowndes was born in Clarksville, West Virginia, Feb. 21, 1845. He graduated at Allegheny College, Meadville, Penn., later receiving the degree of LL.D. from his alma mater. He was governor of Maryland in 1895-9. He was a capitalist, being president of the Second National Bank of Cumberland, Md., his home town, and of the Union Milling Co. of Allegheny County, Md., also a director of the Fidelity and Deposit Co. of Baltimore and of the New York Mining Co. He was a lifelong Republican.

**ANOTHER MURDER ON HAWAII**

**RELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN PERPETRATED BY THE OLD FUNAKOSHI AND WATANABE CROWD.**

**HILO, January 7.**—On Sunday night thugs, presumably belonging to the same gang who operated here under Funakoshi and Watanabe, assaulted and killed Moriama, a professional gambler and desperate character residing in Smithville.

The Japanese were celebrating New Year's all day Sunday and Monday, and as usual there is more or less fighting among those who imbibe too freely. The police were started Sunday night by a telephone message to the effect that a Japanese had been stabbed to death in Nippon Alley opposite Mochuan Park. When the deputy sheriff arrived, he found Moriama slashed almost to pieces. From the excited crowd of Japanese little could be learned of the affair. The wife of the wounded man charged Mori, a fellow countryman with the dead.

It appears Moriama had been carousing during the afternoon with several other Japanese and was sleeping off the effects of his intoxication, when he was called from his home by Mori, who is suspected of committing the crime. The police believe there was more than one man who took part in the assault. The man's skull was crushed in by a heavy blow between the eyes, besides three heavy gashes in his right thigh, from which he bled to death yesterday morning. There was a cut across his forehead and across each ear, showing there had been a struggle with his assailants. The cutting took place nearby to the man's home and as there are no eye witnesses, the police are at sea. Every effort was made to save the man, but the loss of blood resulted in death Monday morning.—Hilo Tribune.

**PRATT AND DESHA**

WASHINGTON, January 8.—The President has ordered the nomination of Joseph G. Pratt as postmaster at Honolulu and of George L. Desha as postmaster at L. I., to be sent to the Senate tomorrow.

**DELIVERY OF PRISONERS.** Washington, January 8, 1905. (Received at 9:20 a. m.) To the Japanese Consul-General, Honolulu, H. I.

General Nogi reports on Sunday that the delivery of prisoners under capitulation was completed on Saturday. The total is 878 officers and 23,491 men, whereof 441 officers and 229 orderlies so far gave parole. Generals Fock, Smyrnoff, Gorbatovsky and Admiral Willmann preferred to be sent to Japan as prisoners, while General Stoessel will leave Dalny homeward on the 12th inst. TAKAHIRA.
