Times of the tide are taken from the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey tables. The tides at Honolulu and Hilo occur about one hour earlier than at Honolulu. Hawaiian standard time is 10 hours 30 minutes slower than Greenwich time, being that of the meridian of 157 degrees 30 minutes. The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m., which is the same as Greenwich, 3 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and moon are for local time for the whole group.

U. S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE—WEATHER BUREAU. The following data, covering a period of 28 years, have been compiled from the Weather Bureau and McKibbin records at Honolulu, T. H. They are issued to show the conditions that have prevailed, during the month in question, for the above period of years, but must not be construed as a forecast of the weather conditions for the coming month.

Month of January for 28 years. Temperature. (1870-1894, inclusive). Mean or normal temperature, 71°. The warmest month was that of 1898, with an average of 72°. The coldest month was that of 1892, with an average of 69°. The highest temperature was 84° on January 19, 1891. The lowest temperature was 54° on January 27, 1895.

Precipitation (rain, 1877-1895, inclusive). Average for the month, 3.25 inches. Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more, 13. The greatest monthly precipitation was 10.05 inches in 1897. The least monthly precipitation was 0.17 inches in 1878. The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive hour was 5.30 inches on January 25, 1897.

Clouds & Weather (1884-1894, inclusive). Average number of clear days, 14; partly cloudy days, 12; cloudy days, 5. Wind, (1884-1894, inclusive). The prevailing winds have been from the northeast. Station: Honolulu, T. H. Date of issue: December 30, 1904. ALEX. McC. ASHLEY, Section Director, Weather Bureau. Note:—Only precipitation data taken from record of Dr. Robert McKibbin.
