Both men took heavy punishment, although Burns landed the harder blows.

The Chicago man showed himself faster on his feet, more clever in dodging, and he won on points. The first few rounds were even. Barry taking the third and Burns the fourth and fifth. The sixth was a stand-off, Barry had the seventh, while the next three went to Burns, as he landed some terrible hooks, his left-handed jolts shaking Barry's head frequently. Barry braced up in the next two, but the fourteenth and fifteenth were Burns'. In the last five rounds Barry did most of the leading but he failed to guard himself and Burns did some good in-fighting. Burns was much fresher at the end.
