BROWN'S POSITION IS SATISFACTORY

MERCHANTS AND BUSINESS MEN SATISFIED WITH HIS STATEMENTS.

Satisfactory progress towards the opening of the campaign was made at the meeting of the County Committee last evening. A. M. Brown stating his position on the question of the resolution adopted by the committee some days ago said:

"Inasmuch as I am a candidate pledged to support the Republican platform and Republican principles I, of necessity, owe allegiance to the present administration, which is a Republican administration."

Mr. Brown went on to say that as far as Governor Carter was concerned, he and the Governor had their personal differences which could never be healed, still he (Brown) recognized Governor Carter as the head of the Republican administration, and owing allegiance to that administration he, of necessity owed allegiance to him as Governor, and consequently the administration in the coming county campaign.

Mr. Brown further stated that as there had been some misunderstanding as to his position and the statement had gone forth that business men, or certain business men, would not contribute funds to the campaign on that account, he was willing, personally, to put forth his best endeavors to aid the finance committee.

Mr. Brown was added to the finance committee which now consists of John Waterhouse, E. R. Adams and A. M. Brown, and as the position of all concerned is satisfactory to the merchants generally, it is believed that the necessary funds for the campaign will be readily secured.

The executive committee was appointed as follows: H. Murray, A. H. Moore, C. Zeigler, J. C. Quinn, Logan, W. W. Goodale, Fern, Dwight, Kealoha.

All of the candidates have now endorsed the resolution of fidelity to the administration, national and territorial.

It was announced that Mr. Plummer, nominee for deputy sheriff of Waiwai would not run, and Representative Oscar Cox had been chosen in his place.
