Times of the tide are taken from the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey tables. The tides at Kahului and Hilo occur about one hour earlier than at Honolulu. Hawaiian standard time is 10 hours 30 minutes slower than Greenwich time, being that of the meridian of 157 degrees 30 minutes. The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m., which is the same as Greenwich, 0 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and Moon are for local time for the whole group.

U. S. Department of Agriculture. Weather Bureau.

FINANCING OF MAUI COUNTY


Said To Be a Question of the Character of Men Elected by the Voters.

WAILUKU, June 10.—C. D. Lufkin, cashier of the First National Bank of Wailuku, on being asked regarding the question of financing Maui County, replied: "It depends on the men elected." If the voters elect a Republican majority of the Board of Supervisors, and L. M. Baldwin for treasurer, it is probable that the First National Bank of Wailuku will finance this county until money is received from taxes which are to be collected in November. If on the other hand, the Home Rulers are elected, Mr. Lufkin states positively that they will obtain no assistance from the bank, and more especially if Clement Crowell is elected for treasurer. This matter of financing the county was outlined by H. P. Baldwin at the political meeting on last Thursday night. The question of location has not yet been considered by the different candidates. This matter will probably be considered when it is known who the elected candidates are.
