Politics In Maui County:

An Active Campaign Going on—Kahaulelio is Throwing Down Lyons for Judge Kalua.

WAILUKU, June 10.—A political meeting was held at the Wailuku court house on last Thursday evening, at which the district candidates for Wailuku spoke. Quite a crowd had gathered at the court house, and at 8 o'clock, Chairman Kepoikai called the meeting to order, and announced S. Keliinoi, candidate for deputy sheriff of Wailuku, as first speaker. Mr. Keliinoi made a short address in English and Hawaiian. He was followed by D. H. Case, candidate for County attorney, who spoke at length with reference to county government. H. P. Baldwin, in his address, outlined the probable expenditures of the County of Maui, and expressed himself as thoroughly in favor of county government. He impressed those present with the necessity of voting for men who have the confidence of the financiers, as it will be necessary for the county to commence borrowing money almost at the outset.

The Republican candidates at large returned from West Maui during the early part of the week, and commenced their tour on to the districts of Makawao and Hana. D. H. Kahaulelio, candidate for auditor on the Home Rule ticket, is using all his efforts in favor of J. W. Kalua, the independent candidate for sheriff, and throwing down Ben Lyons, the Home Rule candidate, in strong terms. At the same time, Kalua has another worker in the person of R. J. K. Nawahine, who is endeavoring to take votes away from Saffrey's friends. It is believed by many that Kalua being in the run for sheriff, is the salvation of Saffrey, as whatever votes he will obtain will mostly be from the Home Rule camps. Kalua is a fluent speaker, and his flow of oratory has great weight with the more ignorant class. Charles Wilcox, candidate for auditor, will have easy sailing, over D. H. Kahaulelio. J. M. Vivas, nominee for county attorney on the Home Rule ticket, it not campaigning at all, and as he puts it, he will leave it to the people whether to vote for him or Mr. Case. L. M. Baldwin will probably have smooth sailing in being elected for treasurer, as his opponent, Clement Crowell, will probably not be able to poll many votes. The supervisors are the most spoken of, and it is practically assured that the board will be Republican in the majority. T. M. Church of Paia, has no opponent for his district. H. P. Baldwin is practically assured of Wailuku district. While Wailuku and Waiehe may give Cornwall the majority, yet Punene will pull very heavy for Mr. Baldwin, so that the chances are very much in favor. It is also understood that William Henning of Lahaina will have hardly any opposition. The fight for supervisorship will probably be in Molokai and Hana.

POOR BASEBALL ON SATURDAY

ELKS WIN EASILY FROM THE PUNS AND H. A. C.'S BEATEN BY THE KAMS.

The Elks toyed with the Punahous on Saturday afternoon and beat them by a score of 4 to 2.
