HAS HI THROWN UP THE SPONGE?

REPEATED REPORTS THAT HE HAS

ACHI DROPS HI FOR POEPOE

EVERYWHERE THE ANNOUNCEMENT THAT ACHI WAS ADVISING THE NATIVES TO VOTE THE STRAIGHT HOME RULE TICKET IS TAKEN TO MEAN THAT HENRY HAS GIVEN UP AND IS MAKING A DESPERATE EFFORT TO BEAT BROWN.

Henry's supporters threw up the sponge early this morning,—or at least enough of them did to make an important change in the situation and with the spirit of "Anything to beat Brown." They tried to lead their followers to vote for Poepeo. The news spread some alarm among Republicans, who knew already that their man had a strong foe in Poepeo, but at noon there was a revival of enthusiasm all along the line. A visit to the Fifth District, where the reported throwing up of the sponge took place, showed Brown enthusiasm at a high tide, Poepeo men also making strong claims and the Civic Federation out of sight. The report of the withdrawing of Henry was due to a speech made by Senator W. C. Achi, who has been a worker for the Civic Federation. Joseph Fern, according to the report, was in the same class. Both of course denied that they had changed round so suddenly.

LONDON, June 20.—Great Britain has not been officially advised by Japan regarding the present crisis in the fighting between the Russian and Japanese armies in Manchuria and the suspension of negotiations for peace. It is believed in military circles that Marshal Oyama is in a position to administer a crushing defeat to General Linevitch.

WASHINGTON, June 20.—The Loomis-Bowen case which arose over the dispute between rival asphalt companies and President Castro of Venezuela, has been settled in favor of Loomis. Bowen, former U. S. Minister to Venezuela, will probably be dropped from the diplomatic service.

BROWN'S ESTIMATE HENRY KEEPS UP NERVE

There was a feeling of ever over-confidence among the Brown workers this morning. Brown himself was hard at work and in answer to the question stated that the situation was well in hand, victory being certain. "I expect to be elected by about the vote we estimated yesterday," he said.

"We are polling all our votes," said High Sheriff Henry at noon today. "I have lost no confidence in the result and the figures quoted yesterday were none too high."

DEMOCRATS CONFIDENT

The Fusionists were not a whit behind the other people in claiming everything up to noon. They said that their men were getting out to work and that all looked well for Poepeo. The accession of Achi to their ranks heartened them considerably.

NEW WIRELESS SYSTEM

Gen. Wood Says Moros Are Not In Rebellion

SAYS THAT THE RECENT TROUBLES RESULTED IN EXPEDITION OF U. S. FORCES TO CAPTURE GANG OF MORO PIRATES WHO HAD COMMITTED DEPREDATIONS AND VARIOUS OUTRAGES IN BORNEO—WILL BE ABSENT FEW MONTHS.

General Leonard Wood, U.S.A., is a through passenger on the S. S. Manchuria for the mainland. He is accompanied by his wife. General Wood is going to Boston on a flying business trip and expects to return to the Philippines by August or September. He is the commander of the military depart-



was necessary to send out several expeditions against the Moros, but the trouble was not due to an uprising against our government at all, but to the fact that the Moros were being taken by the British authorities. A band of about a hundred Moros had been operating as pirates in Borneo. They committed depredations and killed about 33 people. When the British authorities made it too hot for them, the crowd took refuge in the archipelago. The British authorities then asked us to capture them. Several small expeditions were sent out but I soon saw that bloodshed was likely to ensue, so a larger force was sent after them. A few of our men were killed and a large number of the pirates were killed, and the rest captured. Those who were not killed are being held to await extradition by the British authorities.

"Conditions are very quiet in the Philippines. I left my children there and accompanied by Mrs. Wood am hurrying to Boston on private business. Preparations have been made about the islands for entertaining the Taft party. The various army officers have been advised of their coming. Comparatively brief stops will be made however in the smaller places. I will miss the party."

General Wood is the personal friend of President Roosevelt and was the colonel commanding the famous Rough Rider regiment during the Spanish-American war. The appointment of Wood as major-general in the regular army caused a great deal of friction but the President carried his point.

BROWN'S FIGHT WITH POEPOE ZEAL TO BE THE FIRST TO VOTE

ONLY TWO CANDIDATES IN THE RUNNING NOW AND A LIVELY STRUGGLE ON.

Poepeo paid a visit to some Fourth district precincts this afternoon, and told his followers of the change of Achi and Fern, urging all to stand firm for him.
