Times of the tide are taken from the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey tables. The tides at Kahului and Hilo occur about one hour earlier than at Honolulu, Hawaiian standard time is 30 hours 20 minutes slower than Greenwich time, being that of the meridian of 157 degrees 20 minutes. The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m., which is the same as Greenwich, 0 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and Moon are for local time for the whole group.

### U. S. Department of Agriculture. Weather Bureau.

The following data, covering a period of 30 years, have been compiled from the Weather Bureau and McKibbin records at Honolulu, T. H. They are issued to show the conditions that have prevailed, during the month in question for the above period of years, but must not be construed as a forecast of the weather conditions for the coming month.

Mean or normal temperature, 77.  
The warmest month was that of 1900, with an average of 78.  
The coldest month was that of 1896, with an average of 76.  
The highest temperature was 88 on June 22, 1900.  
The lowest temperature was 63 on June 1, 1891.  
Precipitation (rain.) (1877-1894).  
Average for the month, 0.98 inches.  
Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more, 14.  
The greatest monthly precipitation was 2.40 inches in 1885.  
The least monthly precipitation was 0.24 inches in 1877.  
The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive hours was 0.81 inches on June 22, 1885.

Average number of clear days, 13; partly cloudy days 15; cloudy days, 2.  
Wind. (1875-1904).  
The prevailing winds have been from the northeast.


