# A MANY STORIED CHURCH EDIFICE

JOHN D. ROCKEFELLER HAS GIVEN TEN MILLION DOLLARS TO EUCLID AVENUE BAPTIST CHURCH, CLEVELAND, WITH WHICH WILL BE BUILT AND ENDOWED THE BIGGEST PROTESTANT CHURCH EDIFICE IN THE WORLD—TO BE VERY TALL.

John D. Rockefeller is planning to build a great church in Cleveland, Ohio, which will mount high in the air to provide for many branches of ecclesiastical work. It is to be a new building for the Euclid Avenue Baptist Church, to which organization Mr. Rockefeller has belonged for many years. The following story of the project comes from the Architects and Builders' Journal: Mr. Rockefeller intends this new giant of churches to be his greatest and most lasting monument. It will be a memorial of his philanthropy and interest in religious work. The Euclid Avenue Baptist congregation of Cleveland is the first with which the oil king connected himself. At that time he was simply a grocer's clerk living in a modest little house on Cedar avenue. This was before the call of gigantic finance had reached his ears; before his fertile brain had conceived the idea that the oil industry was beckoning him to shape its marvelous future. Having been superintendent of the Sunday school for many years and deeply interested in everything that pertained to the welfare of the church and denomination, Mr. Rockefeller never forgot his first ecclesiastical home. Sentiment has bound him to it more strongly than to any of the more magnificent churches with which he has since been allied. Those who know him intimately—and many persons in Cleveland do—are not surprised at his ambitious plans for the



future of the Euclid Avenue Church. It church activities require. Even the project not be imagined that the church factors of the enterprise realize that it is dependent upon the oil magnate's would be better, possibly, to confine bounty. A big church it was from its all these accommodations to a lower foundation, and a big church it always will be. Surrounding conditions, however, are such as to place it peculiarly in line with the ideas of growth and enterprise that he has mapped out for it. When built the present structure was located upon the best part of Euclid avenue at that time, as now, among the most beautiful residence streets of the world. The spread of commercialism gradually encroached upon these precincts. The district now partakes more of a business than a residential nature. The church has become a downtown institution, but it is large and prosperous still, and many of the best and wealthiest families of Cleveland are connected with it. Even at that, a contribution of \$10,000,000, made by the richest man in the world, is not to be rejected inadvisedly. The plans of this unprecedented contribution, too, are heartily indorsed by the pastor. The Rev. Dr. Eaton enjoys the confidence of the oil magnate, and the ambitious plans for the church have been largely worked out by him. The pastor was engaged in work in Toronto, Canada, when he attracted Mr. Rockefeller's attention. In selecting him for the work at Cleveland it seems that the oil king's keen judgment of men did not err. "The new church," said the Rev. Dr. Eaton the other day, "will be the biggest in Ohio to a certainty, probably the biggest in America, and possibly the biggest in the world. That it will be the biggest Protestant church in the world I am sure. I am sanguine enough to believe that it will be the greatest church in the world as well. Work on this will be started as soon as the necessary plans have been completed. "Ours will be a church for the individual. It will take the place of the home that, perchance, lies far away. We will make one big family of the homeless men and women who live downtown—who may be fairly well up in this world's goods, but really have no home. "Why is a skyscraper necessary? Well, in the first place, downtown land costs too much to permit our building an old-style church that would be big enough to accommodate our work. "Necessity determines that we must enter into, or at least accept, the spirit of the modern metropolitan building idea. If we cannot have land enough to spread over we can, at least, go up in the air, where there is plenty of room. "Instead of having a magnificent dome that is full of emptiness, we can have space to be used profitably. We want less architectural adornment and more room in which to work. "To do the work before us we must attract. To do that we must advertise. A big church advertises itself. It thus automatically takes care of the work which it accomplishes. It draws the people and houses them because it can draw them. "We need more room because we wish ever. There must be Sunday school rooms, rooms for men's clubs and women's clubs, gymnasiums, banquet rooms, reception rooms, parlors, spaces for library and reception rooms for the pastor, and all the other accommodations that a host of twentieth-century

what may be called (without the slightest irreverence) the greatest ecclesiastical plan the world has ever seen. New York's first skyscraper church, not as large, however, as the Cleveland structure will be, is the Broadway Tabernacle, at Broadway and 50th street. It rises to a height of ten stories. Nearly one hundred large and small rooms are to be found in this structure, including auditorium, chapels, halls, parlors, kitchens and offices. Although occupying a site but eighty feet wide and 187 feet long, the Tabernacle can house 5,000 persons in its various halls and assembly rooms. In the basement is an entertainment hall that is designed like the interior of a theater, except that it is without the rising tiers of galleries. Connected with its stage are dressing rooms; there are footlights and lights in the proscenium arch, and it is equipped with drop curtains and appropriate scenic background. In this room are given lectures, concerts and such other entertainments as are deemed proper for a church. It can also be used as a banquet hall and for church fairs. Devoted to the various institutional features of church work in a great city are the other floors of the skyscraper. One entire floor, for instance, is given over to a museum, in which will be kept historical relics of the church from its earliest days.
