HOW TO SPEND COUNTY MONEY

SUPERVISORS ADOPT A BUDGET WHICH THEY WILL PROBABLY FOLLOW NEXT YEAR.

In accordance with the county act, the supervisors met last night to adopt a budget for the coming year. As the budget is not at all binding upon the board it is not of the first importance, but it indicates in a general way how the money will be apportioned during the year unless some emergency causes changes. The budget provides for the spending of \$600,000, but it is likely that there will be another hundred thousand, which will leave the county very liberally provided for, as the budget as made up by the Ways and Means Committee left \$70,000 unprovided for and it was added as an incidental fund. The apportionments are as follows:

Road Department, \$264,000; Police Department, \$97,500; Fire Department, \$54,600; Electric Light Department \$24,000; Garbage Department, \$24,000; Hawaiian Band, \$16,500; Police and Fire Alarm \$3000; keepers of parks, \$3700; county office rent, \$1200; poundmaster, \$360; Ewa and Waianae District, \$18,000; Waialua district, \$12,000; Waianae, \$5000; Koolauoko, \$12,000; Koolauloa district (a section), \$5000; Koolauloa district (b section), \$5000; County Clerk (office clerk), \$4200; County Auditor (office clerk), \$1800; County Attorney (office clerk), \$7200; County Treasurer (office clerk), \$1800; Kapiohahi Park, \$9,000; fixed salaries, \$20,040; incidental, \$70,800. Total, \$600,000.

Lucas, of the Roads and Bridges committee, said there ought to be a macadamized belt road around the island. Chairman Smith replied that there would be one, and it will probably be one of the first things provided for next year. The grading of Hackfeld street was ordered, on presentation of an agreement by residents that they would curb the street. After some discussion Lucas got authority for his committee to go ahead at once with plans for a concrete sidewalk around Asa park, macadamizing certain parts of the Pall road, and constructing new bridges for Kukul and Vineyard streets. Health matters were brought up by a letter from Governor Carter regarding insanitary conditions in Kakaia and from Pinkham about the Twiloi washhouses. It was "passed up" to the Board of Health. Chairman Moore of the health committee said he had had discussions with members of the Board of Health who were not satisfied with the present methods of disposing of garbage, and wanted a crematory. He said one could be operated for about \$800 per month, which is about the amount of the garbage receipts. Lucas said Pinkham and Dr. Cofer had expressed themselves as sat-

SUPERVISORS MANY OFFER HELP

LUCAS SUGGESTS COUNTY APPROPRIATION OF \$3,000 TO HELP URGE LEGISLATION.

The Board of Supervisors last night adopted the following resolution offered by Chairman George W. Smith:

Be it Resolved, That the Board of Supervisors of the County of Oahu, Territory of Hawaii, hereby heartily endorses the recommendation of President Roosevelt relative to the revenues of the Territory of Hawaii, and that we earnestly urge upon Congress the passage of a bill to that effect;

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to our delegate in Congress, Hon. J. Kalaiananole.

Supervisor Lucas suggested that about \$3,000 should be appropriated to help in the work at Washington in behalf of the proposed legislation. It was stated that this was a matter to be considered later, and no further action was taken than the adoption of the resolution.

CONTRACT AWARDED.

Lord & Belser were yesterday awarded the loan fund contract, by the Superintendent of Public Works, to remove 25,000 cubic yards of material consisting of broken and loose coral from the dumping grounds on each side of Alakea street slip to the dumping grounds on the Bishop estate property. The contract price is \$3750.

At the suggestion of Smith the matter was deferred until the Board of Health makes some move.

An opinion was received from County Attorney Donahitt to the effect that the county could not be held liable for the acts of an officer who broke into the Mendonca home to arrest gamblers he thought were inside. Chairman Adams of the police committee stated that the officer had acted properly and had done right in making the arrests, even if he had to force the door. It was stated that a damage suit for \$5,000 was about to be begun, unless a large window which had been accidentally broken was replaced. Adams was authorized to ascertain what amicable settlement was possible.
