U. S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE-WEATHER BUREAU.

The following data, covering a period of 29 years, have been compiled from the Weather Bureau and McKibbin records at Honolulu, T. H. They are issued to show the conditions that have prevailed, during the month in question for the above period of years, but must not be construed as a forecast of the weather conditions for the coming month.

Month February for 29 years. Mean or normal temperature, 71°. The warmest month was that of 1897, with an average of 74°. The coldest month was that of 1903, with an average of 67°. The highest temperature was 82° on 17th of 1890, 16th of 1897, and 22nd and 23rd of 1900. The lowest temperature was 52° on 16th of 1902. PRECIPITATION (rain) 1877-1894, and 1905. Average for the month, 4.75 inches. Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more 12. The greatest monthly precipitation was 14.00 inches in 1893. The least monthly precipitation was 0.25 inches in 1905. The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive hours was 5.65 inches on February 27th, 1888. Average number of clear days, 9; partly cloudy days, 13; cloudy days, 6. WIND. The prevailing winds have been from the northeast. The average hourly velocity of the wind during February, 1905, was 6.6 miles. The highest velocity of the wind during February, 1905 was 26 miles from the southwest on 17th. Station: Honolulu, T. H.
