**SUNDAY LAW AND SUNDAY LABOR**

**WHAT THE GARDEN ISLAND SAYS ABOUT THE LEGISLATION AND ITS ADMINISTRATION.**

The Garden Island says:  
Attorney General Peters seems to have found it necessary to remind several of the plantations of the dire calamity that would befall them, if he should happen to catch them having work performed on Sundays.  
The Sunday law no doubt is a very good one at least it was so intended by its framers, but like other legal documents it has got to be read and enforced by aid of a little sense. The plantations, like any other employer, hate to pay more for their work than they have to. That they have to pay higher wages to the man performing work on Sunday than other days, need probably not be stated; most of them have to allow fifty percent increase to their men for labor on Sundays. It is therefore, highly improbable, that they would indulge such extravagance, if it was not absolutely necessary. It does not take much knowledge of plantation life to admit that certain work has to be performed, holiday or not, if the enterprise is to go ahead and not suffer injury. Some places, for instance, have just enough water to supply four their cane; the water passes through the land without any possibility of storing it. A day's labor lost would be a day's water lost and would prove disastrous to the cane. The enforcing of the Sunday law as applied to the employment of irrigation men on such places would be gross injustice. At other places enough water can be had only by pumping every day. To stop such plantation from making their pump men work on Sunday would be equally unfair. A number of such conditions could be cited but probably Attorney General Peters will look up the matter himself without having it pointed out.

**SHIP SUBSIDY BILL.**  
WASHINGTON, February 15.—The ship subsidy bill has passed the Senate by a vote of 38 to 27, five Republicans voting with the Democrats in the negative.  
The bill increases the subvention of the Spreckels line of steamers, and provides for the establishment of four new lines in the Pacific ocean. Two of these are to run to Japan and China, and one to the Philippines direct by way of Honolulu. The fourth line is to run to South American ports.  
**KEEP CLOSE TO TREATY PORTS.**  
NEW YORK, February 15.—Missionaries throughout China have been warned to keep in touch with the treaty ports.  
General Manager Schwerin, of the Pacific Mail Steamship Company, says that he regards the situation in China as very serious.

CHICAGO, February 15.—The City Council has voted to submit to the people the question of voting \$75,000,000 in bonds to purchase the street railways of the city.

LONDON, February 15.—Balfour has adopted Chamberlain's policy.
