

ROBINSON AND EXPERT WORK

THE APOSTLE OF CIVIC BEAUTIFICATION TELLS HOW HE FIRST BECAME INTERESTED.

"I was always interested in civic beautification," said C. M. Robinson, the expert who is at present studying conditions here in Honolulu "and shortly after I left college I wrote a series of articles for the Atlantic Monthly on the subject. Those articles were in a sense the cause of my making the subject a specialty. After the articles had appeared I was gratified at receiving a letter from Harper's Magazine asking me if I would go to Europe at their expense to prepare for them a series of similar articles on the progress made in European cities and towns. I was very glad of the opportunity and of course I went. I collected a great deal of data, much more than I could possibly use in the magazine articles, and when I returned it occurred to me that I was really the only person who had this information at hand and that it would be a pity if it were wasted so I prepared the book which I called 'The Improvement of Towns and Cities or the Practical Basis of Civic Aesthetics.' The work met with surprising success, especially in England. It has now run through three editions.

"The success was distinctly encouraging and I later prepared the second work, 'Modern Civic Art.' This too has met with a gratifying reception. It was from these things that my services have been in requisition by different cities and towns in the United States and I can frankly say that the work is a work that I love.

"As to Honolulu, I am slowly evolving a general plan but I have nothing to make public just now as there is much that I have yet to see. I met the Improvement Committee at the Board of Agriculture and Forestry last evening but I was very late in arriving. We discussed a few matters informally, particularly the improvement of Punchbowl and the Beach road. No decision was reached. It was simply a chat round the table."

Mr. Robinson said that he had studied the Pinkham plan for the reclamation of the Waikiki swamps very carefully. "It is an immense project," he said "and has been carefully worked out. If Honolulu is going to continue to grow something of the kind will certainly have to be done."

This morning accompanied by Gerrit Wilder, the expert called on a number of business men and this afternoon he went to Moanalua.
