FEDERAL AUTHORITIES ARE IN FULL CONTROL

OAKLAND, Cal., April 26.—The Federal authorities have taken charge of the relief work, but the municipal authorities are permitted to co-operate with them. Retail dealers are re-opening stores, and penalties have been provided to prevent exorbitant charges for necessary articles. The street cars are resuming service in the district not burned, and it is expected that the electric lights in the same section will be ready for service tomorrow. Families continue to do their cooking in the middle of the street. The absence of any epidemic is most surprising to medical men. The members of the Citizens' Auxiliary police have been disbanded. The water supply in San Francisco is scanty. The Labor Council has announced that there will be no change in the rates of wages prevailing before the earthquakes.

OAKLAND, California, April 25.—There was a severe shock of earthquake at 2:15 this afternoon, one woman being killed. (The cable company announced this shock yesterday afternoon in a service message.)

The surprising announcement lately that Waldorf Astor, son of William Waldorf Astor, is to marry Mrs. Robert Shaw, sister-in-law of Charles Dana Gibson, has excited a lively interest in social circles in both the United States and Europe. Oddly enough, the announcement of the engagement has caused more astonishment abroad than it has here, for so far as their social engagements during the past two years have been concerned, friends of the couple in England are at a loss to account for anything that would indicate that they sought one another's society, and the manner in which they managed their courtship is regarded there as a romantic mystery.

From a matrimonial point of view, Waldorf Astor is probably the biggest "catch" in either Europe or in America, being the principal heir to the immense wealth of his father, which is as great as that of Mrs. William Astor, of Colonel "Jack" Astor and of the latter's sister all put together. Mrs. Nannie Langhorne Shaw is a daughter of Colonel Chiswell D. Langhorne, of Charlottesville, Va., and was the third of the four beautiful Langhorne sisters known as the Gibson girls, one of them having married Charles Dana Gibson.
