Times of the tide are taken from the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey tables. The tides at Kahului and Hilo occur about one hour earlier than at Honolulu, Hawaiian standard time is 10 hours 30 minutes slower than Greenwich time, being that of the meridian of 157 degrees 30 minutes. The time whistle blows at 1:30 p. m., which is the same as Greenwich, 0 hours, 0 minutes. The Sun and Moon are for local time for the whole group.

U. S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE—WEATHER BUREAU.

The following data, covering a period of 29 years, have been compiled from the Weather Bureau, and McKibbin records at Honolulu, T. H. They are issued to show the conditions that have prevailed, during the month in question, for the above period of years, but must not be construed as a forecast of the weather conditions for the coming month.

Month July for 29 years.

TEMPERATURE. (1890-1905.)
Mean or normal temperature, 78°
The warmest month was that of 1900, with an average of 79°.
The coldest month was that of 1894, with an average of 76°.
The highest temperature was 88° on July 28, 1905.
The lowest temperature was 63° on July 1, 1899.

PRECIPITATION (rain 1877-1894, and 1905.)
Average for the month 1.45 inches.
Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more, 14.
The greatest monthly precipitation was 6.03 inches in 1880.
The least monthly precipitation was 0.34 inches in 1882.
The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive hours was 3.17 inches on July 12, 1880.

Principals in Divorce Case in Which Collusion is Now Alleged



The Senate Divorce Committee of the Canadian Parliament, has recommended refusal of the petition of Commander Oprey George Valentine Spain for an act of parliament dissolving his marriage with Mary Beatrice Spain. The committee's report was considered by the Senate on May 30.

The action of the Divorce Committee is based upon a belief that collusion exists between commander Spain and his wife.

The committee reports that it heard evidence under oath, and examined a document dated Hotel Bartholdi, New York, March 23, 1905, and signed M. B. Spain, in which the wife admits misconduct with one Reginald Salmon, and desires that for the sake of her son there be as little publicity as possible in connection with a divorce. The committee says that in its opinion the document produced on behalf of the petitioner, taken in conjunction with the testimony of the petitioner, of St. Charles B. Gwynn, one of the petitioner's witnesses, of the respondent, and of Reginald Salmon, the co-respondent, is evidence of such collusion as to bring the proceedings under rule 152 of the Canadian Senate which provides for rejection of a petition.
