KILLED BY LIGHTNING.
CLEVELAND, Ohio, July 29.—Two persons were killed by lightning during an electrical storm here yesterday.

BOLT STRIKES A TREE.
WELLSTON, Ohio, July 29.—Lightning struck a tree in a grove in which a picnic was being held yesterday, and nine persons were injured, two of them fatally.

TO REVIVE TERRORISM.
ST. PETERSBURG, July 29.—The fighting revolutionists have declared their purpose to order that the campaign of terrorism be reopened.

A SECOND TRAIN ROBBERY.
WARSAW, July 29.—A second train was seized and robbed last night, the robbers getting \$37,500.

SHOOTS WIFE, TRIES SUICIDE.
SAN JOSE, Cal., July 29.—W. O. Wright, a brother-in-law of State Senator Charles M. Shortridge, shot his wife fatally last night, and then attempted suicide.

LABORITE GETS SIX YEARS.
PORTLAND, Oregon, July 29.—Charles Beck, secretary of the Sailors' Union, has been sentenced to prison for six years for assaulting non-Union men.

WINS THE BRIGHTON JUNIOR.
NEW YORK, Salvidere won the \$15,000 Brighton Junior stake.

YACHTS CAPSIZE.
ANGLESEA, July 30.—Two yachts capsized here yesterday. Eight persons were drowned.

NEW JERSEY DROWNING.
LAKE HOPTAKIN, New Jersey, July 30.—A boat capsized here yesterday, drowning three persons.

NEW YORK BOATING FATALITY.
FULTON, N. Y., July 30.—A boat capsized in a squall on the lake yesterday and five persons were drowned.

PASSENGER TRAIN WRECKED.
POUGHKEEPSIE, N. Y., July 30.—A New York Central passenger train has been wrecked. Two persons were killed and fifteen injured.

COSSACKS SUPPRESS MUTINY.
ST. PETERSBURG, July 30.—A battalion mutinied at Poltava. The mutiny was suppressed by the Cossacks with machine guns.

At a meeting in Finland of representatives of 130,000 workmen, it was decided untimely to declare a strike. The foreign press is being censored.

CAUCASUS WAR RESUMED.
TIFLIS, July 30.—Hostilities between the Armenians and the Tartars have been renewed. The town of Shusha has been bombarded for three days and set on fire.
