Foreign News

RAPID NAVAL PREPARATIONS.
NORFOLK Va., September 14.—Crews were ordered yesterday to report to the Newark, Tacoma and Cleveland by midnight. The ships are coaling and loading provisions and ammunition for Cuba.

PHILADELPHIA, September 14.—The U. S. S. Minneapolis is loading stores and coaling. She will be ready to depart for Cuba Sunday.

GENERAL CORBIN RETIRES.
WASHINGTON, September 14.—Lieut. General Henry C. Corbin, chief of the general staff of the army retires today.

FIRE AT TIBURON.
SAN FRANCISCO, September 14.—A fire at Tiburon last night caused a loss of \$100,000.

ANOTHER RUSSIAN MARTYR.
MOSCOW, September 14.—Mazury, leader of a flying group of terrorists has been condemned to hang.

FIRE IN PACKING PLANT.
MILWAUKEE, September 14.—A fire in the Cudahy packing plant yesterday resulted in damage to the amount of \$400,000.

TROOPS LANDED IN CUBA.
HAVANA, September 14.—One hundred and twenty American sailors landed here yesterday and camped in front of President Palma's residence in anticipation of an uprising. The department afterward ordered them to disembark and leave a guard at the legation.

Two American sugar plantations in Santa Clara province have been destroyed.
Zayas, President of the Liberals at Castillo, has offered to surrender to Captain Colwell of the U. S. S. Denver, if the United States will guarantee him a fair trial.

Cienfuegos is besieged by the insurgents and some of the fortifications have been damaged. The U. S. S. Marietta has landed marines there.

BURGLARIES WERE REPORTED.
The house of Frank H. Lillis at 1109 King street was entered by burglars about 3 o'clock yesterday morning and some personal effects taken away. One of the rooms at the Johnson house on Punchbowl street was robbed. M. F. Silva saw two men carrying away a stolen valise in Kukui street about 4 o'clock yesterday morning. A Jap later claimed the stuff. W. W. Bowd's residence on School street was robbed last Wednesday.

MAUNA LOA ARRIVED TODAY
With considerable freight and a fair sized crowd of passengers the steamer Mauna Loa arrived this morning from Maui and Hawaii ports. Purser Friel reports no rain in Kau or Hamakua during the last week. There have been light showers in Kona. A heavy rain fell at Kailua yesterday.
