## THE CHRISTIAN ENDEAVOR

(Communicated). The Oahu Young People's Union of Christian Endeavor will have a conference Monday evening, October 8, at the parlors of the Y. M. C. A. The Union officers, the society's presidents, and one or more members from each of the societies forming the Union are requested to attend.

Secretary Wong Hin of the Union has completed his collection of statistics from the societies in the city and found little progress has been made as far as figures could show. The failure to advance is partly due to the inactivity of the older members. They are ignorant of the fact that the object of a Christian Endeavor Society is to train young people for service in the church. They are defeating the very object if the older members, who have been trained in the society for usefulness in the church, remain content with fulfilling their pledge to the society only and do not try to enlist the younger members to the work. There are now many young members of the churches who should be at work with the C. E. Societies, but are not. The C. E. Society is the only organization in the church through which the young people have chances to prepare themselves to be better church-workers. There are young people who are willing to stay for an hour in the young people's prayer meetings, but feel uncomfortable in the church services. This is an opportunity given to the pastors to extend their influence to the young people and invite them to the services if they, as the heads of their congregations, will come in and say a few words to them.

It is easier for a young man or young woman to bring their own young people to the church. A Christian Endeavor will do this work. In one of the C. E. Societies, the chairman of the Lookout Committee is the Elder of the church. He naturally looks on the chairmanship as the least important and pays little attention to the work of the Lookout Committee, which is the most important committee in the society. According to the opinion of Mr. Wong, the older members should retain their connection in the society as honorary members whose duties are to give financial and moral support in all worthy efforts, but not to hold offices. There is no better way to train young people than to give them work to do. An efficient C. E. treasurer may become a good church treasurer.
