ed in the annual report of Rear Admiral Converse, Chief of the Navy Bureau of Navigation. The responsibilities of the United States in the Philippines, and incidentally in the Far East generally, is given as the reason for the maintenance of an adequate naval force on the Pacific, and the selection of the vessels for the fleet has been made in accordance with the present strategic requirements.

The tentative assignment of vessels is as follows:

ATLANTIC FLEET.

First Division—Connecticut, Louisiana, Maine, Missouri.

Second Division—Georgia, New Jersey, Rhode Island, Virginia.

The seventh and eighth divisions will be held in reserve when their services are no longer required for police and patrol duty.

At an early date it is expected that the Asiatic fleet and the Pacific squadron will be merged into one Pacific fleet under the supreme command of a flag officer of the highest rank in the same manner as the Atlantic fleet is now organized.

The Bureau of Navigation is making every endeavor to secure a battleship strength of sixteen in the Atlantic fleet divided into two squadrons which will furnish every opportunity for the practice of battle tactics and will enable the higher officers to acquire facility in the exercise of a large fleet and in maneuvering one homogeneous squadron against another.

PRIESTS TO BE NATURALIZED.

Father Maurus Diekamp, a native of Germany, and Fathers Edward Goyvaerts and Andrew Lariviers, natives of Belgium, yesterday took out their first papers to become citizens of the United States. They were attended at the U. S. clerk's office by Father Valentin of the local Catholic mission. Father Goyvaerts has been assigned to duty at Walluku while the others will remain at Honolulu for the present.

W. H. CORNWELL IS A DEMOCRAT

SON OF THE FIRST NATIONAL COMMITTEEMAN AT LAST JOINS PARTY OF HIS FATHER.

W. H. Cornwell has joined the ranks of the Democratic party. He made this announcement this morning, although his intention to become one of the Underfilled has probably been known for some time to his friends. Cornwell has been a member of the Home Rule party of Maui, but he has now taken up the faith of his father, and will in future be heard in the councils of the Democratic party.

"I have heretofore in our local matters," he said yesterday, "been a member of the Home Rule party. That party represented to my mind the only practical and effective opposition to the Republican party on Maui, and until such time as the Democratic party could develop sufficient strength to battle with the Republicans I thought it my duty to remain with the element that would be better able to make resistance. But I believe that the time has passed when the Home Rule party can not show that opposition so well as the Democratic party. I have therefore decided to affiliate myself with the latter organization. I believe that we will soon have the party on an excellent basis of organization on the island of Maui. We hope to receive some advice and assistance from the party here."

The news that Cornwell has joined the Democratic party will cause a great deal of satisfaction among Democratic leaders. He has always been regarded as naturally belonging to that organization. His father was the first Democratic national committeeman of these islands. W. H. Cornwell is regarded most kindly by Democrats, both upon his father's account, as well as by reason of his own personality.

A NEW DIOCESE FOR POLYNESIA

It has been decided to establish a new diocese for Polynesia. The Primate of New Zealand, who sails for his home this week, has been in communication, while in England, with the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Bishop of London on the subject, and the scheme has their hearty support. The new see will include the Fiji, Tongan and Samoan groups.—Illustrated London News, N. Y. Edition, Dec. 8.


