## SUICIDE'S VICTIM MAY NOT LIVE

**KALUI IN HOSPITAL WITH THE CHANCES AGAINST HER RECOVERY.**

Kalui, the Hawaiian woman who was shot Monday afternoon by the negro, Charles James who then killed himself, is in a most critical condition at the Queen's hospital where it is said that the chances are against her recovery. Deputy Sheriff Jack Kalakiela is investigating the shooting that may prove to be murder and then the suicide which followed. At present there is nothing definite in regard to what aroused the demon in James.

The story is that the negro was insanely jealous because of admiration other men sometimes expressed for his wife. James was a night watchman at the railroad depot for several years, working on Captain Bowers' patrol, and he has time and again been seen patrolling his beat accompanied by the woman who was his wife. It is said that he was of such a jealous disposition that he would not permit his wife to go home and sleep while he was attending to his duties as night watchman, but insisted that she go there rounds with him, to have her near him and be able to watch her every act. On the other hand there are those who declare that the woman tramped about with her husband at night through exceeding love for him; so there are two stories, the one about as well substantiated as the other, from which the probable truth may be selected.

Be these things as they may, James is dead by his own hand and the woman is in the Queen's hospital, under the care of Dr. Judd, with wounds in her interior occasioned by the bullet which was withdrawn last night by delicate operation and "she is holding her own."

A witness to the tragedy on Liliha street, two doors above Kalui, was the ten-year old daughter of the couple who was terror stricken at the crime and speechless when the officers arrived and attempted to question her.

A neighbor, Nicholas by name, heard a couple of shots and investigated. He found the negro dead and the woman moaning for assistance. It was the morgue for the colored corpse and the hospital, in a hurry in the patrol wagon, for the wounded Hawaiian woman. There it was found that the bullet had entered the woman's right side above the hip and ranged downward through the abdomen.

Kalakiela swore in a jury which viewed the dead man and is to meet again tomorrow night. The weapon of death was found beside the corpse, being a 35-caliber, six-shooter, with two chambers emptied.

## Foreign News By Cable

**ON HERRIMAN'S ROADS.**  
PEORIA, Ill., January 2.—Herriman has issued an ultimatum to Herriman, threatening to extend the strike of the employes of the other Herriman roads to include the firemen of the Southern Pacific.

**SQUADRON FOR JAMESTOWN.**  
LONDON, January 2.—The first division of the cruiser squadron, under command of Rear Admiral Neville, has been selected to represent Great Britain at the Jamestown exposition.

Fear Admiral George Neville was a sub-lieutenant of the British frigate Galatea, which visited Honolulu in 1869, taking the Duke of Edinburgh around the world.

**GEN. WINT ASSUMES COMMAND.**  
HAVANA, January 2.—At yesterday's reception of Temporary Governor Magoon, the command of the military was formally turned over to Brigadier General Wint by Brigadier General Bell.

**CLERGY SHOWS OFFENSE.**  
PARIS, January 2.—No prelates were present at the New Year's reception given yesterday by the President.

**PETERS LAUGHS AT PATTERSON.**

Any insinuation that the attorney general's department had attempted to drive Patterson out of the territory, is absolutely without foundation and is ridiculous in the extreme."
